

STRELITZ DOMINATES L.A. POKER CLASSIC



aniel Strelitz of Torrance, Calif., took home more than \$1M after winning the L.A. Poker Classic. The 27-yearold pro bagged the chip lead at the end of Day 3, Day 4 and Day 5, and though he lost the lead briefly at this World Poker Tour final table, he bounced back heads-up and took down the title. He also gets a seat to this month's \$15K WPT Tournament of Champions.





FLEISHER WINS VENETIAN'S DSE IN VEGAS

The \$1,600 main event of Venetian's Deep Stack Extravaganza finished Feb. 24 and saw Terry Fleisher of Las Vegas and Ryan Rogers of Ohio chop for \$161K each. Timothy Chang of Las Vegas took third (\$90K). The event drew 675 entrants for a \$976K prize pool, easily surpassing the \$750K guarantee. The latest DSE ends April 16.

The next Weekend Extravaganza runs May 3-7, offering guarantees totaling \$235K. The big event is a \$340 Double Stack with two starting flights May 5. Players start with a 25K stack and the levels are 40 minutes. The guarantee is \$100K.

The DSE III runs May 15-July 23, making it one of the longest tournament series to hit Vegas. There are 110 tournaments. The Venetian guarantees more than \$21M in prize money will be awarded.

The series starts May 15 with a \$250 buy-in, three-starting flight tournament that has a \$125K guarantee.

There's a \$1,100 buy-in two-starting flight tournament that's part of the Mid-States Poker Tour starting June 5 and offering a \$2.5M guarantee.

Two \$1,100 SuperStacks (20K chips) are offered. The first one is May 29 and has a \$250K guarantee. The second starts July 14 and has a \$1.5M guarantee. Levels are 40 minutes. A \$1,100 two-day bounty tournament starts July 3 with a \$200K guarantee and has \$300 bounties.

There's plenty of action available for those who prefer disciplines other than NLHE. A \$400 Omaha/8 event is May 31 with a \$20K guarantee. A \$600 three-day Omaha/8 tournament starts June 2 and has a \$150K guarantee. A two-day, \$600 PLO/8 starts June 11 with a \$75K guarantee. Big O is June 13-14 with a \$600 buy-in and a \$75K guarantee.

A \$600 PLO bounty event with \$200 bounties goes June 15 with a \$50K guarantee. A two-day \$600 PLO event starts June 19 and offers a \$75K guarantee. A one-day \$1,100 PLO/8 is June 24 with a \$75K guarantee. A \$1,100 PLO/8 with two starting flights starts June 30 with a \$200K guarantee. A two-day \$1,100 PLO-PLO/8-Big O tournament starts July 5 with a \$100K guarantee.

A \$10K high roller with two starting flights begins June 2. It has a \$1M guarantee. A \$1,600 event starts the first of its three starting flights on June 19 and features a \$2M guarantee. Seniors get their shot June 13 with a \$600 event and a \$400K guarantee.

June 26 is the first of three starting flights for a \$3,500 event with a \$3M guarantee. The main event, which has a \$5K buyin and a \$2M guarantee, runs the first of its three starting flights July 17.

There are more moderately priced tournaments (\$300, \$400, \$600) throughout the event.

On the cash-game side, the Venetian will run a high-hand promotion April 17-May 11. On Mondays through Thursdays between 5 p.m. and 3 a.m., the room will be giving away \$250 every 20 minutes. The room continues to offer a progressive bad-beat jackpot that resets to \$50K when hit.





MEET MIKE BEATTIE

A local CPA who works for a Fortune 200 company in Tampa, Fla., Mike **Beattie** is a regular on the Tampa Bay tournament scene. He became interested in Texas Hold'em in 2003 when a friend showed him an article about a CPA

winning the World Series of Poker. He didn't know how to play hold'em, but he thought. "Hey, I'm a CPA and certainly could win this main-event thing, too, right?"

He always has fun at the table and has a positive personality. His greatest accomplishment in poker came in the 2014 WSOP Monster Stack, reaching Day 4 and finishing 25th out of 7,807 for \$50,202. He played grueling 14- and 12-hour sessions on Days 1-2, respectively. On Days 3-4, he played with big-name pros, guys with millions in earnings. After his dream run ended on Day 4, he took out several friends to celebrate and realized it was the first time he had been outside in four days.

Beattie recommends anyone interested in improving should study hard, using the multitude of available resources and he believes you're doing your game a disservice if you don't. He reads multiple monthly poker magazines and watches as many webinars as he can. He's read almost every poker book but loves the classics such as Doyle Brunson's Super System and Gus Hanson's Every Hand Revealed.

SINGH NABS WSOPC IN PALM BEACH

The Palm Beach Kennel Club hosted the World Series of Poker Circuit in February, continuing its association with the WSOP for a seventh consecutive year. The main event drew 524 entries as IT management consultant Raminder Singh of nearby Delray Beach collected his first gold

ring and nearly \$169K first prize and an entry into the Global Casino Championship on Aug. 8-10 in Cherokee, N.C.

There were plenty of highlights during the "12 rings in 12 days" event, including a victory in the final event of the series by **Maurice Hawkins**, the ninth ring of his career. Hawkins had a phenomenal 2016, winning three WSPOC main-event titles, including back-to-back tourneys in April at Council Bluffs and Cherokee, which earned him honors for Breakout Performance of the Year at the American Poker Awards in Beverly Hills on Feb. 24.

Carlos Loving, a former dealer from the Tampa Bay area, continued his hot run by capturing the Casino Championship title after making three final tables, going heads-up for the ring in two events over the span of eight hours.

He finished second to **Martin Ryan** in the \$580 Turbo (\$15,338), and after immediately jumping into Event 5, picked up another \$15K by winning that tournament. Earlier in the series, Loving notched a 22nd-place finish in the \$365 Event 2 and hung on in Event 12 for a sixth-place finish to hold off **Max Young** for the Casino title.

ISLE CASINO: Uri Kadosh of Davie went on a roll after an early evening break to build his miniscule stack of around 200K to more than 5M in less than an hour, then hung on to win the main event of the Battles at the Beach in Pompano Beach.

The tournament ended with a three-way deal between Kadosh, **Joey Couden** and **Darryll Fish**. Couden received \$120K, while Kadosh collected \$120,035 and the trophy for his slightly larger stack. Fish, who took home the top prize a week earlier at the Big Stack event at Parx Casino in Bensalem, Pa., got \$98K for his finish at the Isle.

The Pompano Beach facility has altered its strategy for tournaments over the past few years, with the \$1,500 buy-in equal to last year, but much less than tourneys played earlier this decade. The focus has been shifted to offer an alternative to the Hard Rock, which Fish, who represents SHR, feels is a wise business decision.

"By dropping some of their buy-ins, they've found a niche where they can appeal to a different crowd, while still having a big enough main event to attract the higher-stakes players," he said. "I feel it has been a good decision for their business and I like where they are headed."

HARD ROCK HOLLYWOOD: The World Poker Tour Seminole Hard Rock Poker Showdown got under way March 31 and will hold its televised final table April 5. The first week of April will feature the \$10K SHR Finale (April 2-6) and a \$25K High Roller on April 4-5.

BITTERSWEET BURNS: Hard Rock tournament director Tony Burns received an APA nomination for Industry Person of the

Year, and while he didn't win, he did capture a trophy on the felt upon his return to South Florida. The 34-year-old poker veteran took over the TD role in Hollywood in August 2015 after working at the Isle for eight years as a dealer and evening TD.

He's obviously too busy to play much poker, but took down Event 9 at the Isle's Battles at the Beach. Burns collected \$2,178 and the trophy by winning the \$75 event, his first career title.

CENTRAL FLORIDA

SEMINOLE IMMOKALEE: Josh Gibson captured the WPT DeepStacks Main Event on Feb. 26 for \$50K and a \$5,250 seat into the Seminole Hard Rock Poker Open championship. The property has hosted some unique events in the past and has growing tour-

nament series that have been won by some of the best West Florida players. The WPTDS went to **Filipp Khavin** in 2015 and **Nathan Papp** in 2016, while the Seminole Immokalee Challenge went to **Herbert Woodbery** in 2016.

Khavin finished 15th in this event (\$3,000), while one-time WSOP ladies champion **Marsha Wolak** was 13th (\$3,500). Tampa philanthropist **Anthony March**, who just made a deep run at the Aussie Millions and donated much of his winnings to charity, made the final table and cashed for \$8K.

Gibson squared off with Papp for the title in a heads-up match that lasted 45 minutes. With Papp down about 5-to-1 in chips, he took a deal that scored him \$42K for second. The two have played many times, but more so in cash games. The next major series here will be in September.

DERBY LANE: With Friday night tournaments occasionally playing out until 6 a.m., the St. Petersburg poker room decided to offer a \$230 freezeout with a \$10K guarantee. A freezeout means there will be no re-entries and no rebuys; you are one and done.

New promotions include progressive high hands at specific times weekly (Monday 7-10 p.m., Thursday 3-6 p.m. and Friday-Saturday 2-5 p.m.) every 45 minutes.

The \$1-\$1 NLHE and \$2 limit games can win \$500 (\$25 to players at the table, the rest to the winner), \$1-\$3 NLHE games can win \$1K (\$50 to players at the table, the rest to the winner) and \$2-\$5 can win \$2K (\$100 to players at the table, the rest to the winner).

This promo is subject to change so call ahead.

HARD ROCK TAMPA: Where Derby has answered the Friday night tournament scene, Hard Rock has been dominating the Saturday tournament scene. The Triple 30s (30K units, 30-minute blinds, \$30K guarantee for \$250) has been getting around 300 players since the event debuted in January.

This tournament has been so immensely popular, that registration begins in the middle of the week. First place has paid \$15K-plus, a great weekly addition to the Tampa Bay area.

OCALA GAINESVILLE POKER: Pat Garrity, who once ran this poker room back when it was Ocala Poker and Jai-Alai, has returned as manager.



ELIAS CAPTURES WPT IN ONTARIO

Darren Elias outlasted 488 players to win the WPT Fallsview Poker Classic in Niagara Falls, Ontario. All cashes and prize pools reported here are in Canadian dollars. Elias, a New Jersey resident, earned \$335,436 to increase his live winnings to \$4.47M.

David Eldridge was second, a performance worth \$224,613, while the third-place finisher, **Jean-Christophe Ferreira**, pocketed \$144,465.

Andrew Chen of Ontario collected \$106,865 for fourth, increasing his career take to more than \$4.8M. Germany's **Manig Loeser** was fifth (\$80,149) for his second cash of the series. **Abdull Hassan** was sixth (\$64,316). The prize pool was \$2.2M.

Canadian players took four of the top five spots in the \$1,100 event as **Mike Leah** of Ontario took home \$244,244 for first, giving him more than \$5.7M lifetime earnings. American **Matthew Grocholsky** was second (\$172,589), followed by **Dan Kalpakis** (\$112,201).

Toronto's **Xuan Liu** won the \$2,500 event for \$304,056, while **Ryan Yu** got \$213,185 for second. The event drew 753 runners for a \$1.67M prize pool.

CONNECTICUT

NEW CASINO SOON? East Windsor has been chosen as the location for a third casino in the Nutmeg State, this one a joint venture between the Mashantucket Pequot Tribe, which owns Foxwoods Resort Casino, and the Mohegan Tribal Nation, which owns Mohegan Sun. The \$300M property would be just minutes from Bradley International Airport and, strategically, only a short shot down I-91 from the future home of the Springfield, Mass., MGM casino, which may open in the summer of 2018. The Massachusetts property plans to have a 20-table poker room, so it's likely the new Connecticut casino will have poker as part of its 150 table games, though no solid plans have been released.

"From the beginning, we've said that we want to site our new facility in a town that's eager to have us," Mashantucket Pequot Tribal chairman **Rodney Butler** said. "East Windsor fits that bill, and we're thrilled to enter into a partnership with them." The state Legislature needs to approve the deal before ground can be broken.

PARX BIG STAX STILL ROX IN PHILADELPHIA

Parx celebrated its 20th Big Stax tournament series in collaboration with World Poker Tour DeepStacks Tour from Feb. 8 to March 1. In addition to the usual \$300, \$500, \$1,500 events, the series included a \$2,500 Big Stax final event. WPTDS offered live streaming and coverage of the main tournaments throughout the schedule.

The series kicked off with the \$340 tourney that drew 1,883 entrants for a first-place payout of \$92,942. After **Hung Truong** took fourth for \$28,121, the three players left made a deal. **Josias Dos Santos** took the title for \$68,250 while **Carlos Alvarado** and **Gregory Weber** collected \$65K and \$56,773, respectively.

Vinnie Papandrea claimed the \$550 event for \$103,676 after 14 hours of play on Day 3. Heads-up play took 23 hands as **John Attanasio** finished second (\$65,557). Among the notables at the final table were **Joe "Worm" Palma**, who took sixth (\$17,580), and **Anna Antimony**, who came in third (\$42,719).

Antimony, who chopped heads-up in Event 1 at the Borgata Fall Poker Open for \$126K, holds \$300K-plus in tournament earnings, most of which came this past year. She said she was due for her third-place finish at Parx.

"It was a long time coming, but I knew I'd eventually make a final table at Parx," she said. "We were all so deep that it seemed like nobody was busting or even getting short, but things eventually started to move."

Though the final table didn't yield anything but multiple bad beats, Antimony kept herself well-adjusted by maintaining focus.

"I promise you'll see me at a final table again soon."

The WPTDS main had a \$957,300 prize pool, drawing 660 players for the \$201,991 prize, a \$3K package to the WPTDS Season Championship and a massive amount of POY points. On Day 3, after 13 levels and nearly 16 hours, four players chopped: James Poper, D.J. MacKinnon, Justin Liberto and Phillip Hui. Other notables included Travis Hartshorn, Loni Harwood, Victor Ramdin and Matt Mendez.

Liberto was third, adding \$83,285 to his \$2.1M earnings.

"The tourney was a very unique experience being able to play a final table with two of my very close friends," Liberto said of MacKinnon and Hui, who was fourth (\$60,980). "All of us being able to walk away with six figures was amazing."

After a crushing hand of set over set, MacKinnon was second

(\$127,800), marking his biggest live payout. Poper also claimed the biggest win of his career, taking the title and \$201,991.

"I didn't have a great 2016 and I had definitely lost some confidence along the way," he said. "Everyone from a \$1-\$2 recreational cash player to the elite's playing the highest tournaments go through downswings, so part of being a professional is being able to deal with those tough times mentally. The deep run at Parx was a nice reminder that I have

the ability to play well. Hopefully the run serves as a launching pad for a successful 2017 and beyond."

Darryll Fish won the Big Stax \$2,500 title as the final event came to an end with a three-way chop between Fish, Mark Herm and Joseph Hanrahan. The event drew 137 entrants,

52 of which won their seats via satellites. Fish and Herm took home nearly \$64K each after Hanrahan was third (\$55,459).

MOHEGAN SUN POCONO: The NEPA Poker Open runs April 23-29, with 11 events and numerous satellites, some as cheap as \$18. The \$550 main event is April 29 at 11 a.m. The series opens with a \$340 Black Chip Bounty event on April 23 at 11 a.m. Most events are NLHE, but on April 28 there's a \$125 hold'em-PLO event at 11 a.m. For more details, be sure to visit mohegansunpocono.com or call 888-946-4672.

AQEL NOTCHES \$208K IN WISCONSIN

n early February, the World Series of Poker Circuit visited ▲ Wisconsin for the first time, stopping at Potawatomi Hotel & Casino in downtown Milwaukee. The stop kicked off by setting a state attendance record with 1,272 entrants in Event 1, a \$365 re-entry, which Ty Veras won for \$67,726.

The \$1,675 main event saw 32-year-old Alex Agel best a field of 677 entrants to capture the \$208,184 first-place prize and a seat into the Global Casino Championship. Agel's win came four months after he topped a field of 595 entries to win the Mid-States Poker Tour at Potawatomi for \$138,385.

"Playing for that amount of money is a lot easier because I just recently had a big score myself," he said. "It was more that I just wanted to win a WSOPC main event. That was huge for me."

Other winners included: Yousef Anbar (Event 2, \$580 NLHE, 235 entries, \$29,371); Winston Ackeran (Event 3, \$365 NLHE, 324 entries, \$22,842); Leon Gao (Event 4: \$365 NLHE, 179 entries, \$14,500); Josh Reichard (Event 5, \$365 PLO, 227 entries, \$17,021); Travis Lauson (Event 6, \$365 NLHE six-max, 247 entries, \$19,639); Eric Guth (Event 7, \$365 Monster Stack, 532 entries, \$34,310); Nadya Magnus (Event 8, \$2,200 high roller, 119 entries, \$71,398); Kalpesh Shah (Event 11, \$580 NLHE, 170 entries, \$22,950), and **Scott Quimby** (Event 12, \$365 NLHE, 246 entries, \$18,083).

Byron Ziebell won the Potawatomi Casino Championship after cashing four times and reaching two final tables, including a win in Event 10 (\$365 NLHE) for \$19,547. Ziebell needed at least a ninth-place finish in the final event, which is what he got. He was awarded a seat in the GCC for the feat.

The WSOPC is slated to return here in 2018.

CHICAGOLAND

TROPICANA EVANSVILLE: Jason Gwinn outlasted a record field to win the MSPT regional for \$35K. The 511 entries made it the largest tournament the property has hosted and more than tripled the advertised \$50K guarantee.


Gwinn, a 47-year-old mailman playing in just his second MSPT event, overcame a more than 10-to-1 chip disadvantage during heads-up play with Tammy Wargel.

"Poker was all I was doing for a whole year, but Dad said I had to get a real job," Bohnen said of his time away from the game. "I sort of faded from poker. Last Christmas, I decided to start playing again and had a lot of luck right out of the gate. This is my biggest win by far, but it's still back to work tomorrow. It's going to be a really fun day though."

PERSPECTIVE: CALL THE FLOOR

THIS ISN'T THREE CARD POKER, SO HAND'S DEAD

In a tournament in a Minnesota casino, there was a raise Land one caller preflop. The flop came king-high with two clubs. The original raiser bet and the caller mucked. Before the pot was pushed, the raiser triumphantly flipped his hand over

> and threw his cards on the table. Three cards slipped face up across the table: the A - K - 8.

The floor ruled the original raiser was able to take his flop bet back, but the caller, who had mucked, was awarded the pot.

The original raiser told the floorman that all he saw was the ace-king and he had no idea that there was a third card. It was ruled that the moment it was found out that he had three

cards his hand was dead. Since the caller mucked his hand and then it was discovered there were three cards in the original raiser's hand, wouldn't the mucked hand be dead first, thus awarding it to the raiser? How can someone win a pot after they fold their cards to a bet? How can someone win a hand when they had three cards?

ELLIOTT SAYS: This situation was ruled correctly. The principle applied here is that the no player may receive the fruit of the poisoned tree. Everyone that has been to law school or who has watched all 100 seasons of Law and Order will get the reference.

The player dealt three cards tried to win the pot with an ineligible hand. By the rules of the game, he was obligated to protect his hand and announce he had inadvertently received three cards on the deal.

That he played the hand and tried to win the pot knowingly or not isn't relevant. As soon as he put chips in the pot with a fouled hand, he put himself in a spot where he could only lose those chips and never win the pot or any of his opponent's chips. So, regardless of when his opponent mucked, the fouled hand is considered mucked first, leaving his opponent holding the last live hand in the pot.

Having the correct amount of cards in your hand for the game you are playing is a fundamental rule of poker. To not enforce this rule fairly and firmly would reduce the requirement to have the correct amount of cards to a mere suggestion, most likely rendering the game virtually unplayable. It's not an accident that players caught with extra cards in the Old West were generally treated like the worst kinds of criminals.



ALWAYS KEEP YOUR POKER DREAM ALIVE

Some of my students are scrappers. Scrappers tend to be winning players and let's just say what I like most about this style of play is that players who use it pick up more than heir fair share of dead money. Lots of dead money equals profit

equals "let the good times roll." When scrappers take a flop, they are creative. Missing the flop does not deter scrappers. They bet out if checked to, they float the turn, they are known to check-raise their mothers. Indeed, scrappers are street fighters.

Often, my scrappers have an Achilles' heel. It just goes with the territory. Players who are aggressive don't like to lose and therefore when

stuck, they have a tendency to play long arduous sessions. These long sessions are bad. I have three ideas that will help you with your numbers if you're a grinder and perhaps your hourly winning rate is not as good as it should be:

NO. 1: Why is that song *Closing Time* on my mind? The casino will be there tomorrow. Simply set a quitting time and stick to your guns. When a player is stuck, his mind starts to play tricks. The longer your session lasts, the more likely this is happening. We start to open our game little by little. Soon we find ourselves in hands where we are out of position. We

aren't fresh and we're not playing our best. Anything less than our best means we are on tilt and 17 hours later, we've wiped out a profitable week of solid play. Have a game plan and stick to your guns.

NO. 2: Quitting is not quitting. Get married to the idea that your session takes place over 100 hours of play. When you leave stuck, you're not stuck but simply in a downswing. Imagine if you were an investor and every time your stock swung negative you put in a sell order. That would not be a winning strategy. Quitting is simply taking a break. Your 100-hour session begins again tomorrow. Fail to plan, plan to fail. You are a poker player. If you need help with your poker plan, email me and I can assist with getting you on the right track. It's important your goals are realistic and attainable.

NO. 3: Strike a balance with poker and the rest of your life. Any pro athlete will be happy to share with you the fact that when things at home are good, their play mirrors their life. Bad stuff off the table takes its toll on our poker numbers. The greatest thing about being a poker player is you're the CEO. You get to do what you want to do. Keep the dream alive and stick to your plan.

THERE IS MORE TO POKER THAN 'SEEING' IT

Someone from Sweden emailed me to ask some relatively easy questions: Could I teach him about position, appropriate bet-sizing and pot odds? Sounds simple, right?

At the end of the email, he told me he was blind, which

meant I couldn't share my screen with him, like I do at first with all prospective clients.

He had software that allowed him to hear commentary as the cards were dealt at Poker-

I decided to be his eyes and ears and do a video broadcast, like play-by-play on the radio.

I did my best to describe every detail as if he could visualize what I viewed.

I quickly dumped the first two videos, I was forgetting so much to comment about, and this was much harder than I initially thought.

Finally, I picked a micro-limit cash game and began to describe the action: where the button was in relationship to my position, how much money everyone had, stats from a poker tracker to indicate loose or tight play, any notes I had on players, how much the blinds were and what each player bet in succession.

I still was all over the place and had to refine and define terms and actions quicker.

I then made a video, the first one I sent to him, with a better understanding of how to proceed and to help this client. He played the video and had a lot more questions, so I listened carefully and then the a-ha moment occurred.

Why not switch him to becoming a single-table tournament expert? He loved this idea. Everyone started with the same amount of chips, the blinds were known and the intervals moving up were established.

All he needed to know was the bet-sizing before him and his position. This is where the aforementioned software aided me. It told him amounts bet, though he had to figure out the total and calculate what his bet should be if he for example, reraised.

To finish the story, I produced the video (it's on YouTube) and he appreciated the information and set out to play a few tournaments.

He finished third in his first SNG and won his next tournament. Of course, he has been having mixed results since, but he is gaining more insight daily.

ELIMINATE THE IDEA OF GETTING EVEN

The gambler's fallacy is a concept as old as the first bet: ▲ "The roulette wheel has hit red 10 times in a row; it's guaranteed to hit black this time," is the mentality buried deep

inside everyone. You need to fight the urge to think this way and one of the big ways the gambler's fallacy rears its ugly head as a professional poker player is the idea of getting even.

TRYING TO GET EVEN LEADS TO ERRATIC PLAY: If your goal is to get even in a session that you've been losing, it easily can lead to poor decisions, getting you involved in spots where you don't

need to be. You generally will have a time constraint on a session and as this approaches you'll see yourself taking marginal spots or even bad ones, while the opposite is true sometimes when trying to lock up a big win.

YOU'RE EVEN WITH YOUR BANKROLL WITH EVERY HAND: This was something I read close to the beginning of my poker career, though I can't remember who said it. It's been one of the best pieces of advice I've followed to this day.

When each hand starts, your bankroll is your bankroll and you simply need to make the best decisions during that hand to end up winning money at the end of it. Next hand you're

doing that again.

DON'T COMPOUND LOSING STREAKS: Losing streaks are going to happen and they can get pretty nasty, especially in tougher

I noticed this in my play when I've had multiple losing sessions in a row and my mind starts to think about getting in the positive for those weeks rather than just booking a win in this session.

I also noticed I was going into sessions with a different mindset and I was pushing the issues a lot more. Sometimes you can run perfect and this can be a good thing. Most of the time you slip into that same poor play mentioned above when you're losing in a session, but you haven't even started to lose.

So the next time you're down two buy-ins and you're flatting a raise with I-4 suited, take a step back.

Think about whether this is a correct play; think about why you might be making such an erratic play and just calm down.

The game of poker isn't going anywhere for a long time and the novice players aren't going to dry up in our low-stakes games. The gambler's fallacy has been destroying bankrolls since the dawn of time; don't be its next victim.

A RIVER BLUFF FOR 57.6 MILLION CHIPS

If you found **Qui Nguyen**'s dominating performance at the World Series of Poker exciting and you wish you could play like that, there's good news. His upcoming book, From Vietnam to Vegas: How I Won the World Series of Poker Main Event, will contain

BLINDS: 1M-2M.

PREFLOP: Vayo raised to 5M on the button and Nguyen threebet to 14.9M with A♣-9♦. Vayo called.

FLOP: A♦-8♣-2♠. Nguyen bet 17.9M and Vayo called.

TURN: 5♠. Both players checked.

RIVER: 3♠.

NGUYEN'S COMMENTARY: "Gordon thought for a long time on the flop. It was clear he wasn't trapping me; he was genuinely considering a difficult decision. He would never slow-play a flush on the turn when I had showed so much strength so far. Only with hands like A-J, A-10 and A-9 would he just call my

three-bet preflop, call my flop bet and check the turn to control the pot size. It would be a disaster at this point for me to check the river and lose to A-10. So, I turned my top pair into a bluff and went all-in immediately for Gordon's remaining 57.6M chips. He can't have the K♠ or Q♠, so he can't call."

I served as Nguyen's advisor for the final table. The ESPN live stream was on a 30-minute delay. Amazingly, when he walked over to the rail he wasn't interested in seeing Gordon's cards on ESPN. He was that confident that Gordon held A-J, A-10 or A-9.

I watched the replay. Antonio Esfandiari said, "Wow, what a boss. Qui Nguyen, no hesitation, insta-all-in!" Norman Chad said, "No spade, all heart." That really summed it up. His read makes sense, but to process that so quickly and trust your read enough to instantly shove for 57.6M on the river? Vayo looked sick about that bet. He quickly folded his Av-9v; they would have chopped the pot.

LEARN TO PLUG LEAKS WITH THESE TIPS

When asked about the variance of poker from a psychological perspective, I often say, "I can handle losing, but I hate it when I make a mistake."

And I hate when I misread a situation. After all, as a psychologist, I should be pretty good at people reading. Nonetheless, I have discovered a leak.

Often, I think I'm being bluffed when the villain really has the best hand.

forthcoming.

This could have to do with my table image: an older man who's not that concerned about money and plays fairly tight. So I think my table image makes me ripe for a young loose-aggressive player to bluff me.

It could have to do with my day job as a forensic psychologist. I evaluate those in the criminal justice system who may not be fully

OK, I did the first step: self-discovery. I tried to understand myself, how I make decisions, my behavior and want to plug this leak as fast as I can.

I have the skills to avoid tilting when I make this mistake, as I'm pretty good at hiding my feelings and usually save my tilting behavior for the ride home. But I have to plug the leak or I will drip money continually.

I write out my thoughts and set a goal of watching hands I'm not in, trying to determine if someone is bluffing or has the goods.

I watch live and archived poker and try to determine who's bluffing and in what situation.

I question myself as I'm playing. Am I raising or calling because I think I have the best hand, can push the other person out or think the other person is bluffing? Have I bet so as to give the would-be bluffer the chance to fold?

A good bluff always tells a good story. The problem is having the nuts usually tells a good story, too. The easiest bluffs to pick off are those desperate ones that make no sense. Well, really the easiest to pick off are when I have the nuts. I only can be sure when my river all-in gets called it's not a bluff.

What else can I do? I can put my opponent on a range of hands and if his range beats me, I need to consider folding.

The keys to plugging a leak:

- Realizing you have a leak and didn't just have bad luck
- Setting goals to fix the leak
- Work on a viable strategy to fix the leak
- Keep track of the leak.

And, as always, keep your head in the game.



NEVADA'S POKER REVENUE DOWN

Poker revenue is off 5 percent year over year in Nevada, continuing a steady downward trend from its high mark in 2007. The state also has lost more than 35 poker rooms and more than 400 poker tables in the past seven years. CHRIS: If they only had five or 10 tables left in Nevada, I'd be worried. If you're looking at this from the high mark, then what was the low mark before that? Things are starting to settle down to normalcy it seems like. Everyone wanted to jump on the bandwagon and make it last as long as possible. But I'm not terribly concerned. **SCOTT:** As you said, even though we're on a decline, we're still higher than we were before the boom. Until we get below the pre-boom numbers, I don't think we should be tragically concerned about these numbers.

HAVE POKER CLICHÉS RUN THEIR COURSE?

There's a stream of stories about elected officials "keeping their cards close to their vest" or playing a "high-stakes game of political poker." What do we think about these clichés defining our game?

CHRIS: I really want to go "all-in" with this topic. I'm going to "let the chips fall where they may." Here's the "deal." Get it? I don't really think this is a bad thing. You'll find vernacular thrown around in any conversation that's about some other topic or theme. It just happens that poker is a great way to explain situations. If it's something that keeps poker on the minds of people, I'm all for it.

SCOTT: I think there are two things here. One is the general use of clichés, which you touched on, and I generally hate. But then the other one is ... "keeping their cards close to their vest." How many people have played poker with a vest on since **Wild Bill Hickock** was shot? It doesn't really say anything. People have a general idea of what that means, but when you stop to think about it, you can't keep your cards close to your vest. You can't take them off the table! So it doesn't even make sense anymore!

APA WINNERS

The third annual American Poker Awards ceremony was in late February and among the winners were Jason Mercier for Moment of the Year for his incredible World Series run, Aria poker director Sean McCormack for Industry Person of the Year, and poker TV king Mori Eskandani was honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award. SCOTT: I read an article where the headline was "Few surprises at American Poker Awards." I didn't see anything that really jumped out at me, either. I'm happy for **Sean McCormack**. He's a really great guy and he's doing some great things at Aria. I'm a big fan of Matt Savage and obviously we have to appreciate everything Mori has done for poker TV. Almost all of the interesting poker TV shows that we used to have are because of him.
