# **Online optimism**

We here at Ante Up Poker Media are an optimistic bunch. We support our industry wholeheartedly and always try to find the good in poker people and their ventures.

When Black Friday darkened our poker lives on April 15, 2011, it hurt so many of us; we wondered if online poker would survive in America. It took some time, but a few states were progressive enough to recognize the value of having a regulated online poker market.

While we, of course, endorsed these efforts and applauded the states' ability to get legislation passed and enacted, pessimism crept into our thoughts because we were concerned about player liquidity. Could a small state such as Delaware (less than 1M people) truly thrive with such a small player base?

Though Nevada (3M) and New Jersey (9M) have healthier populations, it still was an uphill battle to achieve sustainability when you consider how many of those people are poker players, how many of those are willing to play online, etc.

These three states still host online poker and gaming, but things could be better. And that's why New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie, Nevada Gov. Brian Sandoval and Delaware Gov. John Car**ney** recently reached an agreement to allow their states to pool their players to increase revenue growth. It's a no-brainer, but red tape always has its sticking points, so to get this agreement truly is monumental.

Once the product is submitted for testing, it's expected to be approved easily. And as if on cue, Pennsylvania Gov. Tom **Wolf** signed a law to allow online wagering, too, just as we were writing this.

From Day 1, Ante Up has supported a federally regulated online poker market and we believe this is a huge step toward that goal.

Once the government sees this as the success it should be, and the revenue that comes with it, it's our hope other states will follow suit, just like Pennsylvania just did, until it's inevitable that Congress has to put together a comprehensive online gaming plan with regulations and protection before it misses out on an extremely viable tax-revenue stream.

We'll hopefully see you soon at the online tables.

Oh, and did we mention it was his birthday? And it came two weeks before his wedding?

"It's a little surreal as I'm a mathematician and don't really believe in 'luck' or superstition, but it really seemed like I had good luck and it was just meant to be," said Haletky, who start-

ed playing poker in 2004 and progressed to playing 150 tournaments a day online before Black Friday.

"I have just been very slowly working my way up in stakes," Haletlky said. "I want to be sure I'm one of the best players at each level before moving up."

The Ante Up NorCal Classic featured nine other events, kicked off with a 208-player field in Event 1 and ended with two events on the last day, which local favorites Pat Lyons and Chris Hinchcliffe won.

The series offered players a lot of variety, including an Omaha/8 event and modest price points, with only two side events having buy-ins greater than \$160. One interesting twist on nolimit hold'em was the Change Up, which started nine-handed and switched to six-handed shootouts when it got to 24 players and ended with a heads-up bracket won by **Howard Tan**.

"I would like to congratulate Jaime Haletky on winning the title," Thunder Valley director of poker

Ben Erwin said. "The heads-up battle with Justin Mackey was full of action with both having their chances to be victorious."

The Ante Up NorCal Classic was the latest in a long line of successful tournament series at Thunder Valley Casino Resort, a AAA Four Diamond luxury resort that features a Las Vegasstyle casino, 300 oversized and well-appointed guest rooms, a spa with complimentary steam room and sauna access for hotel guests, and a wide variety of restaurants, bars and entertainment venues, including the signature High Steaks Steakhouse, to keep players entertained when away from the poker table,

as well as plenty of cash-game action in the poker room.

"The sixth annual NorCal Classic was another great week of poker at Thunder Valley Casino Resort," Erwin said. "Players appreciated the small changes made to the main event. Playing to the money on Day 1 was a hit. It was a long day, but players that advanced and those who were eliminated were pleased with the design. This format will definitely be something that we will use going forward."

Next up for Thunder Valley Casino Resort is the WPT DeepStacks Championship, which runs through Dec. 5, and 2018 will feature two Ante Up Poker Tour series, bookending the World Series of Poker.

The Ante Up NorCal Classic moves to May and will be followed by the Ante Up World Championship, which for the first time will begin and end in July.

"The Ante Up NorCal is the first stop in the 2018-19 season and we look forward to welcoming all of the future season champions as we work toward the Ante Up Worlds in July back here at Thunder Valley," Erwin said. A

# **OAKS HOSTS 2 DECEMEBER NORCAL EVENTS**

The Oaks Card Club in Emeryville, Calif., is offering two special tournaments this month. The first event, Dec. 9, is a \$200 Omaha/8 tournament at 11 a.m. The second is a \$1,500 no-limit hold'em tournament at 1 p.m. on Dec. 16. 

## DE SILVA EARNS \$70K AND A WPTD TITLE

World Series of Poker bracelet-winner, topped a field of 325 players to win the WPT DeepStacks San Diego Main Event at Ocean's Eleven Casino. De Silva earned his first WPT DeepStacks title and \$70,675, which included a \$3K package to the



season-ending WPT DeepStacks Championship.

"That was a pretty nice feeling," he said. "I busted on Day 1B for one bullet, but then I re-entered and ran it up pretty quick, and I had the lead the whole way. I ran a lot better than I played, but that's all it takes sometimes."

De Silva came into the final table as chipleader and he never relinquished his lead.

"It was a pretty nice situation," he said. "There were a lot of short stacks, so I just kept raising. There was a lot of pressure at pay jumps. I didn't have to deal with any big flips or big showdowns. I was just able to chip away at them. It worked out very conveniently."

The tournament came down to De Silva vs. **Arthur Hahn** for the title, but it didn't take long. Heads-up play took just one hand.

"It was pretty funny, the very first hand I had aces and I had been shoving on him for the past three hours," De Silva said. "And then I limp and he goes all-in. It was nice."

De Silva had earned \$198,720 for had place at the Legends of Poker at the Bike in September 2016.

Hahn earned \$47,430 for second, followed by John David (\$30,500), William Santos (\$22,585), Edward Guergis (\$16,945), Louis Schaffer (\$13,555), Veronica Daly (\$11,275), Mateus Lessa (\$9,035) and Craig Walrop (\$6,770).

PALA CASINO: Alan Gomez of San Diego won the River Card Championship for \$2,317 on Oct. 29, beating nearly 70 players. His three jacks topped Carlsbad's Juan Duff, who had a pair on the final hand. Duff earned \$2K, followed by Rodney Clarida of Temecula (\$1,219), Danette Smith of San Clemente (\$896), Mark Burry of Lakeside (\$768), Dave Connell of Rancho Cucamonga (\$679) and Dwayne Copeland of Fallbrook (\$587).

**BICYCLE CASINO:** The WSOPC runs Dec. 1-12.

**CHARITY EVENT:** The third annual City Summit Celebrity tournament will be Jan. 7 at the Hotel Intercontinental in Los Angeles. The buy-in is \$500 and re-entry is allowed through first hour. ## WYNN TOURNEYS INCREASE, INCLUDING SENIORS

The Wynn is hosting the Wynn Signature Weekend through Dec. 3. If you read this in time, the highlight is a \$600 tournament with a \$250K guarantee that has three starting flights beginning Nov. 30.

Dec. 3 is a \$300 survivor tournament with a \$20K guarantee. It has a payout of \$2,500 for one in every 9.65 players.

A \$400 senior event, which runs Nov. 29, offers a \$25K guarantee, 30-minute levels and a 15K starting stack. The next dates for this senior event will be Jan. 3, Jan. 31, Feb. 28, April 4 and May 2.

The regular schedule for Wynn offers a daily noon tournament. Monday-Thursday is a \$140 tourney as players get a 10K stack and 30-minute levels. On Fridays and Sundays, the buy-in is \$200 and there is a \$10K guarantee. The levels are 30 minutes. Players start with 10K chips and there's an optional \$100 add-on for 5K chips at the end of the fourth level.

**TREASURE ISLAND:** There are three daily tournaments; all have \$77 buy-ins and feature 20-minute levels with 15K starting stacks, and offer a \$500 guarantee. The 12:30 p.m. offers a \$10 dealer add-on for 10K chips. The 6 p.m. and the 10 p.m. have a \$5 dealer add-on for 5K. The tourneys have a progressive badbeat jackpot (quads) that starts at \$1K and increases weekly.

The main cash game is \$1-\$3 NLHE with a \$100-\$500 minmax buy-in. The room sometimes spread a \$3-\$6 limit with a \$30 minimum and no max.

# **OKLAHOMA STATE CHAMP IS YOUNG**

The Oklahoma State Championship of Poker, which ended in early October at the Hard Rock Casino in Tulsa, saw the first three events result in chops. **Gary Hammond** won Event 4 (seniors) for \$2,103.

But the big story was when **Tyler Young** overcame nearly 600 entries to win the \$100K main event, earning \$25,157. **Clarence Eldridge** was second (\$15,567) and **Brandon Skala** finished third (\$11,379).

Looking ahead, the World Series of Poker Circuit returns March 15-26.

**GRAND CASINO:** This 13-table enclosed poker room is on the second floor. It has a drink station and offers soft-serve ice cream. Numerous promotions include bad-beat jackpots for hold'em (quads) and Omaha (quad 10s).

Other promos include high hands, royals, and Aces and Kings Cracked. Also running is Monday Night Football squares. Rake is 10 percent to \$4 with \$1 jackpot drop. Comps are \$1 per hour (100 points) and there are double points hours Mondays and Tuesdays.

Tableside food service is offered. Games that typically run include \$1-\$3 NLHE with \$500 max buy-in, \$3-\$6 limit and, on a few nights, a group of regulars get a \$4-\$8 mixed game that may include Big O, razz, stud, stud/8, Omaha and Omaha/8.

Dec. 9 at noon is a \$220 tournament with 30-minute levels and limited seating. Poker-player hotel rates are available. Weekdays the rate is \$59 while weekends are \$79.

AMERISTAR CASINO KANSAS CITY: The Heartland Poker Tour concluded Oct. 16 with William McCracken capturing the \$1,650 main event for \$91,123.

The veterinarian outlasted a field of 279 entries for his first HPT title.

"I'm just happy. It's been a long time," he said "I've had several friends who have won."

The Bolivar, Mo., resident had nine previous cashes on his HPT resume, dating to 2009, but never finished better than eighth. It's the largest victory of his career.

Springfield's **Travis Hiteshew** went heads-up for the title with McCracken for nearly an hour before getting it all-in on a flop of 6-2-2. McCracken, who was covered, held 7-6 for top pair and Hiteshew had A-K. The sixes held and the tournament was virtually over. McCracken took the remaining chips on the next hand to make it official. Hiteshew collected \$58,238 for runner-up.

"You can never give up. As long as you've got chips in front of you, you've got a reasonable chance," McCracken said.

When play began, notable pro **Nick Jivkov** held a commanding lead over his eight opponents. At times, the Des Plaines, Ill. resident looked poised and ready to capture his first HPT title. But he was sent to the rail in third place with \$39,024.

Local purchaser **Christopher Juul** has played in several HPT events, but this was his best finish by far, as the Kansas City man wound up fourth for \$27,535.

Jay McVeigh of Shawnee, Kan., was fifth for \$20,601.

**Daniel Thomas**, a real estate investor from Lincoln, earned \$16,640 for sixth. Just before Thomas' exit, **Beau Wilshire** lost to McCracken, finishing seventh place for \$13,866. Wilshire played his way to the final table for just \$200.

Local **Joseph Maggio** also qualified for just \$200. The airline employee got tangled up early on in a huge hand with Jivkov. They got it all-in for the lead with Maggio holding pocket aces to Jivkov's queens. Maggio was in good shape until the board brought a straight for Jivkov. That hand ended the day for Maggio. He took home \$11,489 for eighth.

# BALZANO WINS ISLE OPEN IN S. FLA.

Three players who made last year's Isle Open final table returned to Pompano Beach again in late October to try to capture the title.

But it was local grinder Paul Balzano of Sunrise who flipped the 2016 results as he took home the trophy and \$112K after being knocked out in ninth place last year.

Defending champ Edward Novak was the first player eliminated from the final table when his flopped trips lost to William Valladares of Costa Rica, who picked up a full house on the turn. Valladares, who finished third, also eliminated the whitehot Sam Panzica in ninth place. Panzica entered the event after arriving from bestbet Jacksonville, where he finished runner-up in the World Poker Tour main event a year after winning the title there.

Panzica, who finished fourth in this event last year, also won the WPT event at Bay 101 in March and final-tabled the High Roller at the Seminole Hard Rock Poker Open in August.

But it was Balzano who had the last laugh at the Isle after defeating Michael Aron of West Palm Beach in heads-up play to bring home his biggest career victory since winning the main event of the 2014 Wynn Summer Classic in Las Vegas. The Bronx native has been on a roll with three final tables at the Hard Rock, including a six-handed event in the WSOPC in September, the \$2,650 event in the Big 4 at SHRPO and the main event of the Lucky Hearts Open in February.

Other South Florida stars who picked up trophies at the Isle Open series included Alex Turyansky and Maurice Hawkins.

HARD ROCK HOLLYWOOD: The Seminole property unveiled plans for a new 450-foot tall guitar-shaped hotel, which should be completed by summer 2019 and will feature an 18,000-squarefoot poker room.

Next up is the Fun in the Sun Poker Open, a five-day series between Christmas and New Year's Eve. The \$560 main event is Dec. 30 and features a \$50K guarantee. Two of the earlier events will give players a chance to win a seat in the \$1,100 WPT DeepStacks event \$130. The \$350 Black Chip Bounty tournament offers a spot in the \$3,500 Seminole Hard Rock Showdown's main event in April.

MARDI GRAS CASINO: Plans to re-open the casino and its Big Easy Poker Room after extensive damage from Hurricane Irma have been pushed back indefinitely.

PALM BEACH KENNEL CLUB: William Wynant got \$31K from the bad-beat jackpot when his quad 10s lost to the straight flush of Rocco Laso of Boynton Beach. Laso collected \$15,534 while the other seven players at the table each took home \$2,219.

He was a consummate family man and had only just married Jessica, the love of his life, two months before his death. When he wasn't dealing or spending time with family, Harrington was playing in a tournament somewhere or shooting pool with friends. He will be missed. — Ron Hope

#### MISSOURI

FINE PERFORMANCES: St. Charles' Matt Paten, who won the Heartland Poker Tour Main Event at Ameristar St. Charles in the beginning of October, was only three places shy of making consecutive HPT final tables.

He finished 12th in the \$1,650 main event at Ameristar Kansas City for \$7,726, just two weeks after the St. Charles event, bringing his career cashes to just shy of \$150K. Deep runs by other St. Louis locals included Neil Patel (19th, \$4,137) and Greg Radosh (26th, \$4,160).

Patel also final-tabled Event 8 (\$1,125 NLHE) at the ensuing World Series of Poker Circuit in Hammond, Ind., where he finished sixth for \$7,252, a day after cashing 18th in Event 7 (\$580 six-max). Hammond is consistently one of the biggest WSOPC stops, having set several records throughout the years.

This year's main event drew 1,247 entries, generating a prize pool of \$1.87M. Paul Fehlig finished 39th and John Nguyen, from neighboring Fairfield Heights, Ill., went out 44th. Nguyen also cashed in Events 4 (\$365 NLHE) and 5 (\$365 Monster Stack). Both players received \$6,191 from the main. Andros Loakimides made it all the way to the final two tables before busting 17th for \$17,751, the second largest cash of his career, bringing his lifetime tournament earnings to \$92,262.



Nick Pupillo of Arizona was second (\$73,596) as the prize pool was \$452,894, surpassing the \$400K guarantee.

**Evan Paushter** (third) earned \$46,648, while **Arthur Ohannessian** (fourth) took home \$37,363 and **Brian Landesman** was fifth (\$28,306).

With an increase in tournaments since the Moneymaker Era, players have more options with variability in buy-ins, fields, quarantees, loca-

tions, structures, etc. Is there a tournament you particularly enjoy playing in your annual poker schedule or does it change depending on what's available? The Parx series is definitely my favorite local tournament to play because nothing can beat that value and structure. Obviously my favorite tournament of the year is the World Series main. I've only played it twice, but there's really nothing else like it.

You recently refused to chop a Borgata Poker Open tournament and took home the trophy. You've also chopped a BPO tournament this year. What are some of the influences in your decision-making? I feel like tournaments are long and grueling, back-to-back days and to make a final table is always an accomplishment. So a lot of times when you make it that deep and you're playing for so much money, especially in the faster structure tourney where the average stack is like 20 big blinds, you're aware of how much luck is involved and you're just exhausted, so making a deal just seems to make sense sometimes. With the last tourney during the BPO, I had a huge lead and the structure is so good so I knew we would actually be able to play.

Also, I feel like the six-max always attracts all the best players so being able to win it outright was just an accomplishment I wanted to achieve. Nobody can take first place away from you.

What do you do in your spare time? Nothing special. I like to spend time with my non-poker friends and not talk poker. I enjoy attending baseball games, going to the gym and watching the ID channel. It's all real-life stories about murder and I'm really into that stuff. Is that creepy? Oh, I've also really gotten into cooking lately. I love food, so it's fun to look up random recipes and have them come to life. — Jo Kim

# PA. APPROVES ONLINE GAMING



The wait has come to an end. Pennsylvania, after four years of legislation struggle, has become the fourth state in America to regulate online gambling. Gov. **Tom Wolf** signed the gambling expansion bill in late October.

The Pennsylvania tax revenue is projected to exceed \$400M in five years, with an estimate of \$154M in the first year while reaching nearly \$275M in the fifth year.

Though New Jersey online gaming tax revenue increases monthly, most of the money comes from the casino rather than poker play. The next step in reviving online poker for the region is in the works to combine the Jersey player base with Nevada and Delaware.

"Pooling players with Nevada and Delaware will enhance annual revenue growth, attract new consumers, and create opportunities for players and Internet gaming operators," New Jersey Gov. **Chris Christie** said in an Oct. 13 news release. "This agreement marks the beginning of a new and exciting chapter for online gaming, and we look forward to working with our partners in Nevada and Delaware in this endeavor."

**SUGARHOUSE:** Poker Night in America returned to the Philadelphia poker room for a third time Oct 24-29. The series kicked off with four sessions of Locals Live \$2-\$5 no-limit hold'em

where five players are randomly drawn for each session to play with two designated pros. SugarHouse Pro Joe "Worm" Palma and Ante Up Ambassador Jo Kim were among the pros in the lineup.

"Poker Night in America tries to cater its production to the preference of the local players in the area," said Matt Glantz, PNIA's producer

and SugarHouse's Poker Ambassador. "So when we come to Philadelphia, we rely on the poker room manager, **Vicki Sims**, to guide us with what format would work best for her room. Her concept of \$2-\$5 Locals Live has received a tremendous response and I would definitely expect to run Locals Live again next year."

The event also featured King of the Hill, a heads-up crowning match between **Daniel Colman** and **Brandon Adams**, who defeated **Olivier Busquet** and **Scott Blumstein**, respectively.

"I really enjoyed the experience of working and playing on a PNIA production," said 2017 WSOP champion Blumstein, who also commentated on the live stream. "Any time poker is getting exposure on a broad level, it's a good thing for the game. So to be able to battle with some great players and provide entertainment to poker fans was something I really enjoyed doing."

The filming crew wrapped with PNIA's \$25-\$50 cash game featuring Glantz, Doug Polk, Brad Garrett, Mike Siegel, Jeremy Kaufman, Andrew Micali and Ryan Miller.

Coinciding with PNIA, the \$100K SugarRush tournament (\$250 buy-in) concluded in a nine-way chop, with Norman Rogers, Nasim Tukhi and Linh Dinh as the top three players paid

\$13,448, \$12,214 and \$10,527, respectively. There were 511 entries for a \$114,766 prize pool after eight starting flights.

SugarHouse welcomed its new poker director, **Tom Bates**, from Hard Rock Tampa in November. Bates has worked on the East Coast before at the Borgata.



**PARX:** The Big Stax \$1,200 main event drew 543 entrants for a \$579,381 prize pool. After three days of play, **Mark Perry, Will Corvino** and **Joe Liberta** chopped for \$100,680, \$89,784 and \$79,180 respectively.

"The win feels really good and to make it through a final table of that level makes it even better," said Perry of his biggest career tournament cash. "Hoping to top this one very soon."

**T.J. Shulman,** who entered Day 2 with 10 big blinds, was fourth (\$35,632). Shulman, a Florida pro, cashed in three events.

"The Big Stax Series is, by far, the best structure of tournaments I've played," Shulman said. "While Borgata is great with guaranteed prize pools, Big Stax is the best in the country that doesn't offer guarantees." Big Stax returns with a \$225 event Dec. 4-10.

#### MARYLAND

**MGM NATIONAL HARBOR:** The room's first series, the Potomac Poker Open, runs until Dec. 4 and features more than \$1M in guarantees. The \$2,700 main event, which has a \$500K guarantee, begins with two opening flights, Dec. 1-2 each at 11 a.m., with Day 2 being Dec. 3.

There's also a \$50K guarantee on Dec. 3 for \$365 at 11 a.m., followed by a \$1,080 turbo event at 3 p.m. On Dec. 4, the series wraps with a pot-limit Omaha events at 11 a.m. for \$1,120.

**NAME CHANGE:** The Maryland Live Casino in Hanover has changed its name to just Live Casino and has a hotel and spa slated to open in early 2018.

In tournament results, the Hallowed Hold'em series, which had \$55K in guarantees, ran Oct. 7-8. **Matt Shoup** won the \$175 event, which sported a \$15K guarantee. He bested 60-plus players for \$3,827, chopping with **Casey Montag** (\$3,819) and **Travor Payton** (\$3,153).

**Ty Purnell** won the \$225 event, which had a \$30K guarantee. He pocketed \$3K for first, followed by 18 players who chopped for \$1,500 each. The event drew 118 entries. **Mike Scotece** won the \$85 event that had a \$10K guarantee. He earned \$2,800.

## BOGGS, BATTAGLIA TAKE WSOPC MAINS IN IND.

Justin Boggs won the World Series of Poker Circuit Main Event at Horseshoe Southern Indiana for almost \$140K. It was the self-proclaimed recreational player's first ring, though the health-and-fitness teacher from Ohio admitted he once entertained the idea of being a poker pro.

"First of all, the final table was just crazy," Boggs said of the skill level among the nine finalists. "It makes me definitely feel more confident about my game." He faced **Scott Montgomery**, who made a WSOP main-event final table in 2008, twotime ring-winner **Chris Carey** and **Wendy Freedman**, whose runner-up finish was the best for a woman in a main event here.

HORSESHOE HAMMOND: Blake Battaglia captured his first

WSOPC ring in a big way by winning the main event at his home casino, receiving \$332K. The pro from Chicago outlasted 1,247 entries, creating a prize pool just short of \$1.9M.

The victory is a tremendous boost to 31-year-old Battaglia's career. The father of three formerly worked as an electrician, but re-

cently transitioned to playing poker for a living.

"It hasn't hit me yet. It's unreal," Battaglia said after his momentous score.

Jonathan Tamayo outlasted 2,349 entries to win the \$365 NLHE opener for \$101K-plus. The 31-year-old Texan owns three WSOPC rings. Tamayo's road to victory was a long and grueling one. He broke through Flight C with a solid stack, then had a day off before entering, what would be, an extensive Day 2. The final table took five-plus hours to complete.

"I just process everything and then time flies. I see the clock, but I don't feel the time. I've done it too long," said Tamayo, whose lifetime earnings are almost \$1.5M.

**Will Berry** and his group of poker-playing friends have a saying: "The key is that you have to want to win." Berry accomplished his goal by taking down the high roller for \$280K.

"I enjoyed this high roller a lot," he said. "I think the structure was great. I actually think this was more enjoyable than the main. Not just because I won, but the people were pretty friendly throughout. It's just a looser atmosphere."

The 25-year-old pro from Oklahoma has established himself as a force on the circuit. He won his first WSOPC ring in March at the Hard Rock Tulsa's main event.

**HARRAH'S JOLIET:** The Mega Bad Beat Jackpot was hit Oct. 15 for \$378K. Combine that with the \$780K paid in May and



Adam Dahlin of St. Paul won the \$2,500 high-roller event, taking home \$43,857 after


beating 52 of Minnesota's toughest competitors. **Dedric Henderson** of

eight-way partial chop and got another \$6K and the trophy when he was the last player standing. The \$280 event featured six Day 1 flights. If players made it to Day 2 from multiple flights, their smallest stacks were bought for \$1,200 each.

#### **IOWA**

RIVERSIDE CASINO AND RESORT: Joe Villhauer won the WPT DeepStacks \$1,100 main event for \$29,875 and a \$3K WPTD championship package at Thunder Valley Casino in California. Villhauer is an Iowa City native but has retired to Tennessee. He was one of the top stacks going into Day 2 and had the lead when final-table play began. Andrew Leopard was runner-up after losing a 5-to-1 advantage when heads-up play began. His bite of the prize pool was \$20,921. Scotter Clark was third (\$13,453).

**PRAIRIE MEADOWS CASINO:** The Altoona poker room will host a \$200 deepstack Dec. 17. Also, keep an eye on the badbeat jackpot. It has exceeded \$107K.

**DIAMOND JO CASINO:** The bad-beat jackpot was \$150K at press time.

HORSESHOE COUNCIL BLUFFS: The Horseshoe Holiday Poker Classic runs between Christmas and New Year's Day. Check with the poker room for more details.

#### WISCONSIN

**REICHARD GETS NO. 8:** In early October, Janesville's **Josh Reichard** 

topped a field of 292 players to win the World Series of Poker Circuit's \$365 Monster Stack at Horseshoe Southern Indiana for \$21,024 and his eighth gold ring.

The win tied him for rings with the likes of **Ari Engel**, **Robert Hankins** and **Chris Reslock**. Two others have nine rings, while Florida's **Maurice Hawkins** is the all-time leader with 10.

**FPC WINNERS:** At the beginning of October, Wausau's **Paokee "PKX" Xiong** topped a field of 249 entries to win the Canterbury Park Fall Classic's Event 2 (\$180 NLHE) for \$9,321.

Also, Oshkosh's **Anthony De Jesus** topped a field of 72 to win the \$340 HORSE title for \$6,221. Waukesha's **Lisa Seamans** came out on top of an 84-entry field to win the \$125 women's event for \$2,285.

#### THE FINAL WORD ON A 162M-CHIP POT

Ayear after **Qui Nguyen** exhibited the power of aggression at the World Series of Poker Main Event final table, **Scott Blumstein** reminded everyone just how successful this strategy

can be. He exhibited repeated success with marginal or weak holdings and consistently outmaneuvered other skilled pros.

For the second year in a row, I've had the opportunity to get insight from the main-event champ. Of course, Qui and I wrote a book together that was just released via D&B Publishing, in which we review 170-plus hands from the 2016 final table. Now, I've had the privilege

of working with Blumstein in the form of 10 video hand analyses that are being released one at a time on Advanced Poker Training (advancedpokertraining.com).

The most memorable hand of the final table involved the affable amateur **John Hesp**. Under the gun, Blumstein looked down at pocket aces, raised and Hesp called from the big blind. The rest, as they say, was history. As Blumstein described, "Just the old A-5-7 rainbow flop, like I drew it up." Both players got tricky and checked the flop and what ensued when a 10 hit the turn was Blumstein's dream scenario: He bet, Hesp raised, Blumstein reraised, and Hesp jumped out of his seat and uttered "the two words I couldn't believe, all-in." Hesp revealed A-10 and was drawing dead. "You can't really explain what it's like to win that kind of pot on that stage. Probably the best moment of my life," he told me.

He also takes issue with the critiques of Hesp's approach. "I

think that's a tough situation for anyone. He had top two pair on a dry board. That's a really good hand." Rather, he thinks this hand needs to be viewed in a greater context: "John doesn't claim to be some poker wizard. For an amateur, that's a tough position to be in. I've spent five years in this game trying to get to the point where maybe I could get away from A-10 there, and I don't even think I would."

I think everyone will enjoy his thoughtful commentary, revealing a man who has worked at his craft and developed into a savvy player by the age of 25. If you want to watch his video commentary on this hand, you can find it in our forum at advancedpokertraining.com/forum, under the Scott Blumstein's Hand Reviews category. This one is available for free, though some will be for members only. •

#### GETTING STARTED IN LIVE PLAY, PT. III

**Editor's note:** This is the final part of a three-part series.

Sometimes, as a beginner, you may have a question or need a little more time to make a decision. Simply say "time" so

the dealer can hear you. This freezes the action and allows you to get an issue resolved or for you to make a final decision. Don't abuse time requests. Here are some other things to consider.

**ACTING IN TURN:** Wait until it's your turn to act. Don't attempt to muck your cards or make a bet before your turn. It's impolite and provides information and an advantage to someone yet to act. And if your river bet is called, you're

required to turn over your cards.

**DON'T DISCUSS HANDS WHILE IN PLAY:** Any discussions of a hand should be done after the hand has ended. Never talk about or show your cards to anyone while the hand in progress.

**TIPPING:** It's common practice for the winner of each hand to tip the dealer. In most games, the dealer receives a dollar or two from the winner. There are players who tip well; you're not required to match their generosity. You should contribute

something to the dealer, though you're not required.

**CASHING OUT:** When you're ready to leave, tell the dealer to deal you out. Put your chips into an empty chip rack and head to the cashier cage or the podium where you purchased them.

**COMPS:** Find out before playing if you can earn complimentary credit for playing a certain number of hours. Some casinos provide you with a meal "comp" and when booking a room, call ahead and always check with the poker room for a poker room rate. Again, based on daily play, you may save a tremendous amount of money for your room and meals.

Being prepared to play poker means you're not distracted, feeling ill or playing with the rent money. You should have a positive attitude, be mentally alert, know the rules, play solid aggressive poker and know when to quit. Having read this three-part series I hope some of the initial fears of playing live have been quieted by the knowledge you now bring with you to the cardroom.

#### WHEN IS IT MOST PROFITABLE TO PLAY?

The holidays are upon us and it's always Christmas at the poker table. Our adversaries hand us gifts, red- and green-colored chips, all day and night, with visions of plum-colored

chips dancing in our heads.

Of course, not all poker tables are equal and it's important to touch on the best (and worst) ways to make sure you receive the most gifts during your poker-playing experience.

**PLAY:** New poker rooms are the biggest opportunity you can find, especially if they're the first in the area.

Whenever poker becomes new to an area, the games are packed with amateurs and the players that have been beating those amateurs in home games. None of these players holds a candle to a pro and it makes for an amazing mix of games.

The craziness diminishes as the room gets older, but consider moving to the area for a six-month period if your bankroll allows it.

**AVOID:** A huge tournament series can provide a great venue for a lot of novice players to take a shot a winning a title for a small entry fee, but it makes small-stakes cash games worse. This doesn't apply to the big games, which might only run during these events, but the small buy-in level suffers. There are

many players who descend upon a casino that are extremely competent and you end up with a much larger percentage of overall winning players per table this way.

**PLAY:** The best time to be at the poker table is the prime time for everyone else to be partying. This is a sacrifice you need to make to continue to play as a pro.

At certain casinos, missing a Friday or Saturday night after a **Chris Rock** show might mean giving up on double your normal hourly rate. It's irresponsible to be away from the tables when recreational players are most likely to be there and probably drunk.

**AVOID:** The nicest, prettiest, room in an area will have the tightest cash games.

This is because the smarter players think like you when they make a decision as to which room to play. Games are pretty bad in Vegas in general, but the finer properties always have been extreme.

**PLAY:** When you're comfortable, make sure you play. All of the rest of this advice doesn't matter if you aren't comfortable playing in a room.

Play in a place where you like being, at a time you like playing and at whatever stakes you know you can beat.

COACH'S CORNER

#### RANGE PLAYS HUGE ROLE IN YOUR ACTION

Once upon a time, poker hands were analyzed in terms of the hand in question. Villain shoves and Hero calls with pocket jacks and the discussion would revolve around whether

the jacks represented a good call. In today's game, advanced players examine a hand in question in terms of range. Furthermore, range is pegged to stack size and stack size is measured in terms of blinds.

Often, after exiting a tournament and on the long drive home, we're left with a nagging feeling on whether we played it "right." All you have to do is call three experts and you guessed

it, you'll get three different answers. That's frustrating. Now you're really confused. Let's delve into a complex yet simple problem and see if we can get a better handle on what makes a poker decision right or wrong.

You're in a satellite, in the big blind and blinds are 2K-4K with no antes. Of note, 22 seats will be awarded and 27 players remain. A short stack shoves for 7K and it folds around to you. All you have to do is call 3K chips and because you have 19K, a call here is a no-brainer.

Not so fast. Stay with me, I want to make this a learning moment. We freeze the clock and jump into our computer and plug in every entrants stack size and there are eight stacks in the 3K-8K range, which is very short, and guess what? This changes the decision from a 60-percent call range to 10 percent. So, you go against your instinct to call and fold, which turns into quite a bit of table banter. Seat 1 said it's a 100-percent call. Seat 2 chimes in that he can't imagine what you folded. This scenario happened to me.

Are you still with me? If this were a tournament that paid 15 spots, yes, it's an auto-call. If the big blind had 33K chips then it's an auto-call. Chips lose their value as time moves forward and blinds increase, so 19K chips may sound like a decent stack but risking 3K at this point in a satellite turns out to be a blunder.

It's your job at the late stage of a tournament to understand your calling-range. A 10-percent range, (my range) is A-A to 6-6, A-K suited to A-9 suited, A-K offsuit through A-J offsuit, K-Q (suited and offsuit) and K-J suited.

In review, it's important to understand what your range is to call. You have leeway to expand or tighten ranges based on observation. However, in this example, the key number that greatly altered our calling range was awareness of all of the short stacks at the other tables. After all, it was only nine minutes later that I was at the cage collecting my tournament ticket.

### YES, THAT'S THE WAY TO DO IT

In a \$1-\$3 no-limit hold'em game at a local poker club, a straddle is on and there are six callers. The dealer thinks the straddler checked his option, but before the dealer could turn over the three flop cards in his palm, the straddler said he was

wanting to raise and raised to \$25.

Another player asked if he saw what was on the flop before he made the raise and the raiser said he had not.

All other players said they have not seen any of the cards. The dealer then put out the flop, burned a card and put the turn face down, then burned another card and put the river face down.

He said he would then shuffle the cards and spread a new flop, but the turn and the river would remain the same should action progress to that point.

Action then proceeded with everyone having the choice to call the \$25 preflop raise by the straddle. Action would then resume once the new flop is shown.

My question is, why would he lay out the flop to begin with? If the issue is that there were the potential a player had seen one of the cards, why would he not just shuffle the cards then?

Since nobody had seen them or potentially just one or two people could have, by simply shuffling the cards you've eliminated any potential advantage someone could have had.

It slowed down the action laying everything out like that and created a ton of confusion on the table on why we were play-

ing in "preflop" action, when a flop was on the table.

By laying out the flop, he's shown everybody what they "should have seen" and it will only create negative emotions in the players seeing what should have been.

**ELLIOT SAID:** The flop is being replaced because it seems like the poker room staff believes one or more players may have both seen the flop and not yet acted on all of the preflop betting.

If that is the case, that flop must be exposed so that all players yet to act will have the same information available to them as the other players that were able to bet with that information.

Negative feelings about the situation are irrelevant. Fairness for all players in the betting is the primary concern and allowing only one or two players the use of that information is too big of a disadvantage for the players that didn't have a chance to see those cards.

#### **POKER PSYCHOLOGY: HEAD GAMES**

#### PRIDE IS OK, JUST DON'T LET IT HURT YOU

It's good to be proud of yourself, your skills and your game. Without pride, you can't be competitive. But hubris and pride can be destructive.

False pride is a huge problem. Some players attribute positive outcomes that were lucky to skill, and some attribute negative outcomes to bad luck and not enough skill.

Poker's clearly a combination of variance, or luck and skill. Skill is a long-term measure, while luck evens out.

Don't let excessive pride lead to destruction by misjudging your sessions when you judge luck to skill.

Pride also figures into good laydowns. Can you lay down pocket aces on the turn or river when the villain jams and pushes you? Or do you let pride get in the way and blame "stupid luck."

You sit at a table in your regular room at your regular stakes and don't recognize many of the people. You're a regular and have pretty good long-term results, so you think these folks will be easy, a table full of fish. You sit back, watch your iPad or iPhone, and all of a sudden you're down two buy-ins. Your pride or hubris kicked in, but in an unhealthy manner. You ignored betting patterns, tells and the flow of the game. Maybe you learned something.

You made a prideful assumption that you were better than them, without knowing them.

There is good pride. It's based upon introspection and an honest evaluation of your skills and ability.

There is bad pride. This is an excessive belief in your skills and abilities that's unrealistic. You start playing games that are too tough to beat. You start making bad decisions, thinking you can control the cards.

The solution is to know yourself, get honest feedback and keep up the self-analytics. If it gets out of control, get help.

And, as always, keep your head in the game.



#### FERGUSON WINS WSOP POY

Chris Ferguson, formerly of Full Tilt Poker, has won the World Series Player of the Year title, and many players are taking to social media to criticize Ferguson for never apologizing for what happened with Full Tilt.

**SCOTT SAID:** How long does this guy have to go before people let it go? I'm not saying people should be excited that he won, or happy or tweeting selfies with him, but are people going to hold this grudge forever? Howard Lederer tried to apologize, I know people didn't like how he did, but at least he tried, and he still got brutalized. So I guess I understand why Ferguson might not want to apologize.

CHRIS SAID: Chris "Jesus" Ferguson, from messiah to pariah. It looks like the poker community isn't ready to turn the other cheek just yet. I think an apology, rather than defiance, would go a long way toward being forgiven. Obviously, he has game, but not a social one. Players, we're a loyal bunch. People took their hard-earned money and put it on a website and said, "I'm going to trust you with my money." And when you hire someone who doesn't do right by your people, you need to stand up and say, "I'm sorry this happened."

#### POKER IN THE OLYMPICS?

The International Federation of Match Poker, an organization that promotes a team version of poker, has been granted "observer status" by Global Association of International Sports Federations, a first step toward possibly being included in future Olympics.

**SCOTT SAID:** We're not talking about actual poker, like we normally play, making it as an Olympic sport, but some version of it. Now, the chances of that are very miniscule, but ... you're saying there's a chance?

CHRIS SAID: If this happens, I'll know the true meaning of bittersweet, because I'll be ecstatic for our sport, our

company and our industry, but I'll be super pissed because we're still waiting for my favorite sport (bowling) to become an Olympic sport. I'd love to see poker get in, but what's next, daily fantasy sports? Pole dancing is also part of this "observer status." Pole dancing!

#### How Dare They Post Results!

Calvin Ayre recently posted a column, saying Israeli poker players are not fans of sites such as Hendon Mob, which post winnings from tournaments, as it provides information to tax authorities in Israel that he believes is misleading, since buy-in, rebuys and other expenses of being a poker pro aren't deducted.

**SCOTT SAID:** I always find it interesting when people get upset when the taxman is going to get his cut. None of us likes to pay taxes, but to say, "Hey, don't put my results on there because that means I'll have to pay the taxes that I'm supposed to be paying." That's not a good enough argument for me. "Life was going great. I was totally cheating my country, but now I can't!"

CHRIS SAID: We post those results. We've gotten those emails, too, with people asking us to take them down because they're going for a job interview. Sorry, buddy, you played in a public tournament in a public event and these results are recorded. You chose to play in this event. You chose to become a poker player and if you want to hide that from your boss, then that's on you, not me. Don't enter the tournament.

#### PROP BET TO LEARN MANDARIN


Poker pro Joey Ingram has taken a prop bet to become fluent in Mandarin in one year. To collect \$45K, he needs to post a 30-minute YouTube video speaking in fluent Mandarin, or he loses \$7,500. The pro plans to watch movies, listen to music and spend several months in China, expecting that it'll take him 2K hours of work to become fluent.

**SCOTT SAID:** It's roughly \$22 an hour, which is not a great hourly rate for a poker pro. But here's the thing I like about it: We talked about the chicken-nugget guy a little bit ago, and some of these other wild bets, and there was nothing positive coming out of the bet. With this, even if the guy fails, he'll probably come pretty close to fluent. So he's learning a skill.

> CHRIS SAID: If he loses, he spends \$7,500, which he could probably buy eight or nine of those Rosetta Stones. But he could also have someone who speaks Mandarin write out a phoneticallysound speech, practice it and use that on YouTube to get his money.
