What does Ante Up see coming in 2018?

- Sluggish, but consistent legislation to expand poker across the United States. Each year, a handful of states look to the possibilities of online poker, but still only three have taken the plunge.
- Texas developing into a poker market. The state that gave poker's most popular game its name always has shunned legalized gaming, but a number of poker entrepreneurs are testing that appetite with membership clubs. If they succeed, casinos could follow.
- Growth of the game abroad. While efforts to expand the game may be slow in the United States, countries such as China and India are taking big steps forward in promoting the game. Steps that might trickle down with some benefits here.

You can't look to the future without remembering the past. Schecter and Ante Up Poker Cruises poker room manager Ramze Suliman were guests on a recent episode of the Ante Up PokerCast. See a summary of their thoughts on the state of poker on Page 50.



TOURNAMENTS

MATT SAVAGE

Executive Tournament Director, World Poker Tour



The poker tournament landscape always is evolving. As event coordinators, tournament directors and casino properties, we need to make sure we're always innovating and adapting to meet the demands of the property and management, but most important, the player.

Tournament poker across the world has become regionalized and you can find a tournament series almost every day within 200 miles of you. With more regional events than ever before, it's a priority of mine and the World Poker Tour that we continue to focus on growing the game globally. In addition to our efforts of expansion into new regions such as China, India and South America, the WPT believes in having something for everyone. There are players at all levels, which is why we have WPT500, WPT DeepStacks and WPT events available.

It's also important we continue to be player-friendly and strive to keep poker fun. This is vital to the game's continued success and the strongest brands will survive based on these notions. One thing that was hurting the game and driving players away was the unnecessary tanking and stalling of some, so I was happy to see leading brands take a stance at improving, such as the WPT implementing the Action Clock.

Another hot-button topic is that of re-entries. Those of us on the operational side of the industry need to play close attention to this. Players are our customers and we need to listen to them. To that end, the WPT and I will continue to work with our partners to best meet their demands. Whether that's re-entry or freezeout, we'll continue to keep the dialogue open and find the best balance.

I believe we'll see consolidation and some of the smaller tours without strong partnerships will fall by the wayside and I don't think that's necessarily a bad thing because there are plenty

of offerings for every bankroll. Tournament poker, while widely scattered, still remains strong and I'm excited to see what players rise to the top make a name for themselves.



POKER ROOMS

ELLIOTT SCHECTER

Director of Poker Operations, Hollywood Casino Toledo

In geographic areas with keen competition for poker, such as Las LVegas, Baltimore-Washington, D.C., South Florida, Seattle, Los Angeles the San Francisco Bay Area, etc., the poker-room promotions are getting bigger to attract players and maintain business levels. This race to the top (bottom?) has created a situation that's leaving many poker rooms overspending their player-supported promotional funds.

This is quite favorable for the bulk of the players in these markets but isn't sustainable in the long term. There are a couple of reasons for this.

First, casinos generally are not in favor of paying for promotions from the operating budget when a player-funded promotion fund is available for this purpose. If most or all the extra revenue generated is plowed back into promotions, then these players need to be producing significant revenue in other areas of the casino for the poker rooms to justify continuing to spend that money.

Second, the poker rooms that find themselves locked in a promotional battle for players are probably going to be hesitant to risk losing those players by eliminating or drastically reducing the promotions and payouts to bring their promo fund deficits under control.

The poker rooms have, almost out of necessity, basically trapped themselves into offering increasingly expensive and unaffordable promotions. The immovable object is colliding with the irresistible force. The most logical outcome of this state of being is for the poker rooms in these markets to increase the amount of promotional money taken from the pots and to possibly increase the rake as well. This has begun in some casinos and may be coming soon to a poker room near you.



MEDIA

DAN ROSS

Owner, Hold'em Radio

Doker fans want more content to watch, but television and cable ratings are rarely strong, even for the largest of the poker shows. The response from poker tours and poker rooms is a greater move to live-streaming their events, easing away from primarily focusing on recorded-for-television products such as broadcasted shows from the likes of World Series of Poker, World Poker Tour, Heartland Poker Tour and Poker Night in America.

The WPT continues in 2018 with the remainder of a oneyear deal to live-stream its various main-event final-table action via PokerGO. This goes along with the deal between PokerGO and the WSOP to live-stream various braceletevent final tables for the next three years. HPT and the Mid-States Poker Tour are among the tours regularly live-streaming their final tables with their production teams.

The reinvention of Poker After Dark by PokerGO drew a huge positive response from the poker-viewing community, with many episodes of this anticipated next year. Poker Night in America's King of the Hill competitions are garnering online fans as well and there's always the growing legions of players streaming their online poker play via Twitch.

More poker rooms around the country are bringing in reporters to provide live updates for main events and tournament series action. The daily live coverage is resulting in increased attendance at tournaments and visibility for the poker rooms and tournaments.

Live appears to be the key word when it comes to the direction the poker media, and the viewers, are continuing to move as 2018 approaches.



PLAYERS

Professional player and SugarHouse Casino ambassador

The most important trend I see in poker deals with tournaments and tournament guarantees. We have never seen so many missed guarantees in the industry as we have seen in the past few months. Major venues are missing guarantees that were easily surpassed in previous festivals.

I'm a bit concerned this is a canary in the coal mine of the overall economy, but only time will tell. This trend of missed guarantees will not sustain, as casino execs never are willing to continually take the hit of covering shortfalls. Guarantees will become smaller in 2018 and players will find less opportunity in the live-tournament landscape. •

BINH NGUYEN WINS FALL COAST MAIN EVENT

Chinook Winds Casino in Lincoln, Ore., ran its Fall Coast Classic Sept. 16-23 and it was a big success as six of seven guarantees were met or exceeded.

Bryan Phillis of Dike, Iowa, (Event 1, \$16K), Sande Slutsky of Portland (Event 4, \$4K), Dan Barker of Poulsbo, Wash., (Event 6, \$4K), Jason Adams of Portland (Event 8, \$4K), Eunhee Chan of Sheridan, Ore., (Event 9, \$2K), Colin Costantino of Portland (Event 10, \$5K) and Kerry Moynahan of Portland (Event 12, \$9K) were some of the winners.

But it was experienced amateur **Binh Nguyen** of Beavertown, Ore., who captured the \$550 main event for \$38K, his second biggest career cash.

Chinook Winds has seven tables and routinely spreads \$1-\$3 NLHE, features Omaha on Tuesdays and stud on Fridays. The room is closed Wednesdays and Thursdays.

MUCKLESHOOT CASINO: The Summer Classic, with \$55K added, ran Sept. 14-18 and was so successful that a few tables needed to be added outside the room to accommodate all players.

Kevin Law of Seattle (Event 1, \$5K), Iffet Erdolen (Event 2, \$9K), Ed Pineda of Puyallup, Wash., (Event 3, \$23K) and Patrick Ngo of Vacaville, Calif., (Event 5, \$32K) were winners. Pineda, Achia Hua, Nicholas Getzen (Atlanta) and Kevin Johnson (Raritan, N.I.) chopped Event 4 for \$20K each.

Ngo, who also took 10th in Event 3, lost the overall championship to Pineda, who won \$6K for the honor.

CAN MGM SAVE LIMIT, SPREAD-LIMIT IN VEGAS?

GM is making a big push to bring back limit and spread-Illimit to its room by introducing many promos specific to \$2-\$4, \$3-\$6 and \$4-\$8 limit games as well as the \$2-\$6 spreadlimit game. All of these games have a \$40 minimum buy-in. Promos include:

60 for \$40: The first 20 players who buy in to a limit game for \$40 or more between 9-11 a.m. and play at least two hours receive \$20.

Free \$50: On Tuesdays and Wednesdays, all players who log a minimum of six hours of limit receive \$50. Players may qualify

Aces Cracked: Lose with red aces between noon and 2 p.m. and receive \$500. Lose with black aces between 4-6 p.m. and receive \$500.

Paid parking: Play six hours of limit in a day and receive \$12 toward parking.

Kings of the Hill: Hit quads in order (from aces to kings) and receive progressive jackpot that starts at \$200. Each week \$2,600 is added to the prize pool, spread out over the quads that have not been hit yet. This promo runs daily from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 10 p.m. to 4 a.m.

Cash back: The top 10 players with the most hours in limit games during the month receive cash back, first

place is \$1K and the minimum prize is \$200.

Players receive \$2 per hour in comps while playing limit or spread-limit.

Additionally, all limit games are eligible for the room's other promotions.

ARIA: The \$240 tournaments at 11 a.m. on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays feature the Big Blind Ante format, which was introduced in its high-roller events. The big blind posts an ante for the table, allowing the dealer to get out more hands each level.

"It leads to a higher percentage of hands dealt, which is a better product and value for the players," tournament director Paul Campbell said. "The response has been overwhelmingly favorable to the point where players are requesting it implemented in all Aria poker tournaments.

Once more poker players experience the benefits of this structure, we believe there will be a push to make this (or something similar) industry standard."

The purple jacket for winning Aria's Poker Masters series in September went to Germany's Steffen Sontheimer, who won two of the five events and final-tabled two others. He won the final \$100K event and took home \$2.73M. New York's Bryn Kenney finished second in the series and earned \$1.08M while Germany's **Fedor Holz** claimed \$1.05M for third.

ORLEANS: For Sunday, Monday and Thursday night football games, as well as the Sunday morning game, seat drawings are held after every score.

> are \$150. Safeties are worth \$150. The table of the drawing winner also gets a \$50 splash pot.



"I had no marquee wins yet, so this was the first big one." <code>Matt Livingston</code> of Windsor, Colo., was second for \$111K, followed by <code>Fernando Galvan</code> of Denver (\$73K), <code>Kevin Boudreau</code> of Colorado Springs (\$50K) and <code>Israel Garcia</code> of Denver (\$37K). <code>Danny Gonzales</code>, a regular face at final tables, also of Denver, was sixth for \$28K. <code>Bobby Garcia</code>, still another Denverite, was seventh (\$24K), then <code>Evan Ross</code> of Golden (\$20K) and <code>Ben Greenberg</code> of Longmont (\$16K).

Golden Gates hosts the Denver Open Nov. 2-12.

IRMA BRINGS OUT BEST OF S. FLA.

C eptember was a rough month for Florida as Hurricane SIrma roared up the peninsula during the first weekend of the month. While most of the poker rooms in South Florida were shut down for a few days, most suffered little structural damage and things were mainly back to normal by the next weekend.

Not so at the Big Easy Poker Room at the Mardi Gras Casino in Hallandale with its roof damaged by a mini-tornado associated with the hurricane and the building flooded. Casino officials had hoped to have the poker room open by the end of September, but a strong rainstorm in mid-month caused further flooding and set the reopening back by several weeks. It should be open by the time you read this.

Kudos to several properties that aided the recovery effort in numerous ways after the storm, including Magic City, the Isle and Gulfstream Park, which all offered their parking lots to serve as staging areas for emergency vehicles from the electric companies. Seminole Coconut Creek allowed its big parking garage to shelter the vehicles of first responders.

Hard Rock Hollywood quickly put together a benefit tournament to attach to the end of its first World Series of Poker Circuit series to raise money for Feeding South Florida.

The event attracted 124 entries and with the silent auction, along with a PokerStars agreement to match all donations, raised about \$55K for the relief effort.

Bryan Emory of Plantation won the event, while a pregnant Natasha Mercier finished fourth two days before her due date. She outlasted husband Jason and several other top South Florida pros along the way, including Jeff Gross, Darryll Fish, Loni Harwood and Asher Conniff. Fox NFL analyst and former Miami coach Jimmy Johnson, whose Florida Keys home in Tavernier was damaged by the storm, donated a \$10K prize package to his annual fishing tournament in March for the auction.

> HARD ROCK HOLLYWOOD: In the main event of the property's first WSOPC, Hard Rock regular Joseph Gotlieb captured the gold ring and \$257K by outlasting former WPT world champ Asher Conniff, Miami's Mauricio Ameller and three-time WSOP braceletwinner Brian Hastings.

Gotlieb defeated 900-plus contestants in the \$1,675 single re-entry event, which easily surpassed its \$1M guarantee. Anton Wigg of Sweden defeated Boca Raton's lan O'Hara for the High Roller title, Melisa Singh won the women's

MEET ILEANA ZAMORA

There are several female poker-room directors in this country, but most likely not one (or any man, for that matter) that has been in that same position at the same facility continuously for the past two decades. Ileana Zamora is proud of that

accomplishment, but thrilled and surprised as well. March 2017 marked 20 years of her running the room at Magic City Casino in Miami.

How's it feel? I'm amazed to be in the same place with the same job for 20 years, but why would I want to do anything else? I am so happy here right now that I couldn't imagine leaving to go somewhere else.

Do some men treat you disrespectfully as a woman in a management position? I don't really see that much. If someone wants to be nasty, they will be just as nasty to a man as a woman. I think being a woman in management is a good thing; women are compassionate and understanding and players like to have someone hear them out about concerns they have. There are no roadblocks for women in this industry. I think they are highly sought-after, but there are just not enough women right now pursuing these positions.

South Florida is such a competitive market, yet in May you did \$820K-plus in revenue despite having just 19 tables and no tournaments. Explain that. No matter what happens around us, the key to success is having the best customer service. You have to listen to what your players want; you have to be on the floor all the time; that is the only way to know what is going on. — Dave Lemmon



You were notorious for firing multiple bullets into rebuys. Is that so much the case anymore? Tell

us about the risk and rewards. For low buy-ins and huge fields, it's such a great value to build a big stack to put yourself in spots to run deep. I would still fire if it needs to be done. The risk is obvious.

You have to have a big enough bankroll and play big stacks well enough to support the multiple entries. Parx's Big Stax or the Borgata Poker Open are great examples. As of now, my biggest win is \$230K, which came from a \$350 buy-in with a huge field. So yeah, I think I have an edge when I have a big stack in a low buy-in tournament and it definitely justifies the number of buy-ins I invest.

As you've built your bankroll through the years, has your game selection changed? The way I look at it is, for tournaments, yes. I always want to play the ones with the most value that I can afford and travel to easily. For cash games, I play \$10-\$10 and up now, whatever game is available.

Mohegan Sun Pocono hosts the Pa Classic from Nov. 26-Dec. 2, featuring 11 events. The series will kick off with a \$340 Black Chip Bounty tournament followed by nightly \$100 deepstack events. The \$550 main event will be Dec. 2 as a one-day tournament and satellites will be available for the main with buy-ins as little as \$18.

BORGATA: The Summer Open kicked off with 3,570 entrants in Event 1 (\$600, \$2M guarantee). **Marshall White** took the trophy and his best live cash, \$330,841. East Coast pro **Greg Himmelbrand** made the final table again as one of the final four standing. Himmelbrand, who won the event for \$243,630 in 2013, finished fourth for \$119,540.

"Always a good feeling and an accomplishment to made a final table in a field of 3,500-plus players." Himmelbrand said.

The \$3,500 WPT main event drew 1,132 entries for \$3.6M-plus prize pool. **Guo Liang Chen**, a Borgata regular, was at the final table as one of the underdogs after five days of play. In just is second career final table, Chen grinded his way through the bigger stacks to win the title and the biggest payday of his five-year career (\$789,058). The Fall Open returns Nov. 7-22.

Borgata also made some changes for its regular cash players by increasing the \$2-\$5 buy-in max to \$1K from \$500.

Among the winners were SugarHouse ambassador **Matt Glantz, Thai Ha** and **D.J. McKinnon**. "We hope to continue in fostering the relationship Poker Night in America has built with Party Poker to bring similar events in the near future," SugarHouse poker manager **Vicki Sims** said.

POKERSTARS RESORTS: PokerStars returned Oct. 6-8 to Atlantic City for its second live series at the Resorts Casino Hotel. Players could win a seat into the \$100K guarantee with a \$220 buyin for as little as 50 cents through online satellites.

"I loved the crowd that came out, so many new faces and so much enthusiasm for the game," PokerStars pro **Jennifer Shahade** said. "Even though the events were super accessible with buyins of \$100-\$200, the atmosphere made everyone feel special."

New Jersey local **John Monahan** beat nearly 410 players for the trophy and \$19,920, marking his biggest win. The series ended with **Chris Moneymaker** winning the \$25K guarantee.

NEW YORK

TURNING STONE RESORT CASINO: The SuperStacks Hold'em Series returns Nov. 23-Dec. 3.

RIVERS CASINO: Popular pro **Shaun Deeb** beat **Michael Lynch** to take the top spot and \$36,559 in the \$260 main event of the Capital Region Classic in Schenectady, N.Y. Lynch earned \$20,600 and **Keith Pierce** (third) collected \$19,600. The prize pool was \$181,565, eclipsing the guarantee by more than \$80K.

JEWELL WINS CINCY'S FALL OPEN

Tack Cincinnati Casino's Fall Open ran Aug. 27-Sept. 3. The \$1K main event saw 549 entries and a \$500K guarantee. There were two Day 1s and several players took multiple shots at qualifying for Day 2. Eight players qualified twice, allowing them to sell back their shorter stacks for \$4K. When the dust cleared, it was Kurt Jewell of Frankfort, Ky., (\$88K) taking home the most money, followed by Frank Dellaria of Burgettstown, Pa. (\$71,082) and **Patricia Till** of Avon, Ind. (\$44,460). Overall, 63 players finished in the money.

Event 1 was a \$350 re-entry event that drew an impressive 1,059 entries from 606 players, including two who bought in 12 times each. The field had players from 18 states and one from Canada to generate a \$286K prize pool. The event ended in a four-way deal with **Doug Holland** of Lawrenceburg, Ind., taking \$29,267 and the title.

Other winners were **Daniel Statman** (\$200 turbo, \$7,413), Jared Trout (\$300 bounty, \$4,569), Donny Phan (\$300 NLHE, \$8,400) and Jared Palmer (\$200 turbo, \$5K). The \$200 seniors event saw John Yengo and Daniel Wood chop for \$6,500 each. The only non-hold'em event (\$300 PLO) was another chop as Perry Klein and Franklin Caldwell made \$10,515 apiece.

JACK CASINO CLEVELAND: The \$100K Pigskin & Poker promotion runs through Dec. 31. Cash-game and tournament players earn drawing tickets by making big hands (aces full or better) from noon until midnight. Each Sunday during the promotion, one ticket will be drawn every hour from noon until 8 p.m., with each winner receiving \$500 in chips. On the final Sunday, prizes will range from \$500 to \$10K in chips.

CHICAGOLAND

HORSESHOE SOUTHERN INDIANA: Mark Smith claimed his sixth WSOPC ring after winning Event 5 for \$10K-plus. The 65-year-old from Georgetown Key., eliminated 127 entries in less than 24 hours, in a scheduled two-day event.

Danny Lawson, down to one 5K chip, make an incredible comeback to win the \$365 double-stack turbo opener.

"Feels good, came from an ante to win it," said Lawson, who survived 154 entries for \$12K.

Ross Ward won his first ring in the \$365 re-entry event for \$39K. The Georgia native outlasted 640 entries, with a prize pool of \$191K.

BIRT CAPTURES RECORD-SETTING EVENT IN MINN.

The Mid-States Poker Tour broke its record for the largest L event at Running Aces Casino in Columbus, Minn., with 383 runners entering the \$1,100 tourney, besting the 367 in 2013. Jeff Birt, a 50-year-old businessman from Bloomington, claimed the \$81,402 first-place prize.

"I thought I played pretty well," he said. "I was shortstacked; I just had to pick the right spots, be patient and let the cards come to me. It's been a long time coming. It was a good time, enjoyable."

Birt had about \$50K in career cashes before this, with his largest being \$7,626.

CANTERBURY PARK: Peixin Liu of Blaine, Minn., won the inaugural \$450 Poker Is Fun Tour event in Shakopee, Minn. Liu took home \$8,501, beating 80-plus entries. Several other notables were on hand, including WSOP bracelet-winner John Reading and local powerhouse Rajee Wazwaz.

> This event had a twist: To be awarded the pot, the winner's hole cards had to be shown, making the event fun and keeping players engaged with each other more than their electronics. Cody Torke of Shakopee took down the \$180 event for \$2,427.

Four-handed Torke, Michelle Day, Tom Marsland and Luke Strawalker agreed to take \$1,800 each and leave the remaining \$1,227 for first. Heads-up players then agreed to chop

another \$400 for Torke and \$600 for Day, playing for the remaining \$227.

Alvaro Gordillo of Saint Paul outlasted a field of 704 entries to earn \$18K from the \$175 Ultimate \$100K event. Eric Anderson took home \$11,500 for second.

NEW TOUR: Next Level Poker, a tour started by Minnesota poker pros Chris "Fox" Wallace and Brian Soja, is gearing up for its first event Nov. 5-26 at Diamond Jo Casino in Iowa.

The \$760 Blue Shark Optics Championship features three Day 1 flights. The series has several "Step Up" tournaments, which are hybrid satellites that also pay some cash in addition to a seat to the next step offering a new approach to earning your way into the tournament at a discount. DIAMOND JO WORTH CASINO: On a quiet Friday afternoon at the end of September in Northwood, the ballooning \$278,813 bad-beat jackpot fell when connected diamonds hit the board and suited connectors book-ended them.

The winner got \$111K and the loser earned \$55K. The rest of the room got \$13,940 each. It's also worth mentioning there's still a chance to win big as the next jackpot was \$138K at press time.

This month, Diamond Jo runs Next Level Poker tournaments. Each Sunday there will be lower buy-ins culminating



in the \$750 Blue Shark Optics Championship running Nov. 24-26.

MESKWAKI CASINO: The Mid-States Poker Tour runs until Nov. 5 with a \$300K guarantee main event. The last stop here nearly paid \$500K.

WISCONSIN

MSPT BURGER: Nov. 13-20, Mark "P0ker H0" Kroon's Players Bar in Madison will offer a "MSPT Burger." The burger will include Mayo, Sweet potato fries (on the burger), Pepper jack cheese and Topped with Avocado. A dollar from each burger will go to charity and each burger earns customers a ticket into a drawing for a \$250 satellite seat



into the MSPT Wisconsin State Poker Championship.

OVER-THE-BORDER SUCCESS: In late September, Lacrosse's **Tony Lacey** finished runner-up out of 383 entries in Minnesota's MSPT Running Aces main event for \$50,325. Janesville's David Nelson was 12th in for \$5,920.

POTAWATOMI HOTEL & CASINO: The Wisconsin State Championship, which has a \$200K guarantee, runs Nov. 17-19 in Milwaukee and costs \$1,100. In early September, the \$354,224 bad-beat jackpot hit. The loser of the hand received \$106,267, the winner \$70,845, and six table shares \$17,712 each.

s I was leaving my local casino, the cage supervisor pulled me aside and said the cashier overpaid me a few days before. He said they have it on video and showed a picture of me leaving the casino but no shots of the transaction or my chips. It was a cashout size that is unusual for me and I remember counting it carefully when I left the table.

The cage transaction was verified by the cashier, the su-

pervisor on duty and again by me. I requested they show me a picture of my chips and they refused for "security reasons." I asked the cage supervisor, "If you were me, would you just turn over \$100 because security said you owed it?" He said security is right 99.9 percent of the time.

I decided the relationship with the casino was worth more than \$100 and gave it to them.

They reciprocated with \$50 in comps, but I'm still a little unsatisfied. Should I have stood my ground? — Dead Money Dave

ELLIOTT SAID: I've seen this situation more times than I can count. Speaking from the operator's perspective, casinos are quite hesitant to ask for overpays to be returned unless it has been verified and reverified. This goes for chip and

slot cashouts and table-games wagers.

Most casinos try hard to return underpays to players. The footage of these incidents almost always is forwarded to the gaming commission or agency responsible for oversight of that casino.

Casinos can't just extract funds from players in the form of recovered funds on a whim nor can they pay out players in the form of a refunded underpay in the same vein. Variances are bad for the bottom line but also have serious consequences for the cashiers.

Recovered variances usually save a cashier's job. All of this is to say casinos don't take lightly at all the retrieval of overpaid funds from players.

Wanting to see a shot of the chips and the cash wasn't unreasonable. The reason for not showing the photos is it may be against regulation to divulge camera angles even though the tinted bubbles are ubiquitous.

It may be tempting to stand your ground without proof and some casinos will back down and write off the money. Some casinos, whether by policy or by regulation, will prohibit you from playing until the funds are recovered.

Unless you were visiting a ridiculously under-regulated casino, I'm pretty certain you paid back money that shouldn't have been paid to you.

You received a nice food comp for your trouble and prob-

ably helped a cashier remain secure in their job. This could have ended much worse for you and for the cashier.

Out of turn action does it again

On the flop of a no-limit cash game in a local cardroom, Player A checks; Player B bets \$21; Player C goes all-in for \$36 in a sloppy way such that there are just a bunch of reds and whites in a pile in front of her; Player D thinks and the dealer hasn't said anything; Player E puts \$21 in the pot out of turn; Player D folds and then Player A goes all-in for significantly more.

At this point, the dealer notices Player E hasn't put enough in to cover Player C's all-in bet. So Player E was ordered to put in the \$15 more because by putting in the \$21, he effectively called the bet.

> Player B folds and it's back around to Player E, who also folds after having had to put in the full \$36 as I just mentioned. Was that handled correctly? What were Player E's options if not? — David Bloomberg

ELLIOTT SAID: Action out of turn is binding and Player E's \$21 belongs to the pot. The placing of this money on the layout caused two players to act, Players D and A. Player A continued with the theme of acting out of turn and effectively trapped this \$21 in the pot by moving all-in.

Had he asked for a correction of Player E's wager, most poker rooms would have allowed the removal of the incorrect bet because no one had acted after him; Player D's lack of action in this spot is im-

material. In no-limit and pot-limit, all players must wait for any bets in front of them in the betting order to be moved to the betting area and completed or specifically verbalized.

Any players acting when these conditions aren't met can be considered to be acting out of turn. All of this being said, Player E's options in this situation should've been to fold and surrender \$21 to the pot or call Player A's all-in wager to remain in the hand.

THE LITTLE THINGS ARE WHAT MATTER

While playing this game, it's important to remember there are little things you can do that, when combined, have a are little things you can do that, when combined, have a large effect on your bottom line.

These aren't going to make a break-even player a winner,

but if you're winning, using some of these tips could improve your hourly rate. Don't just take my word for it, I brought in some heavy hitters to help me out: two-time bracelet-winner Steven Wolansky and Seminole Hard Rock pro Michael Laake.

First, here are a couple of mine:

Against a novice player, chose which chips to bet wisely. When I'm playing someone I don't think

is paying enough attention to the intricacies of the game, I will often decide to make bets with bigger chips when I want them to be more likely to call.

In a simple way, \$400 in red \$5 chips looks a lot more intimidating than three black \$100 chips and four \$25 green chips.

This absolutely should not factor into your decision with any player you believe is thinking about these things.

Don't worry about your bet size if you don't believe your opponent has a "fold button." If you really don't think your opponent is going to fold to your river bet because they've made that decision and that's that, you need to be moving all-in, or close to it, no matter how much is in the pot or what you bet on the last street. The first time you bet \$800 into a \$100 pot and get called you can email me for my Ethereum address and send a thank you.

Michael Laake

Pay attention to your opponent's amount of chips. Take a quick look at your opponent's stack and size it up.

If someone has four stacks of red (\$5 chips), \$275 worth of green (\$25 chips), and four odd red chips on top, I'm likely betting an amount that does not exceed \$295 because breaking into a fresh 20 stack actually creates minor resistance.

Be aware of what the table's opinion of you is. ... and what you can do to be more friendly. You get so many breaks from people that are unwarranted when you're friendly to them. I've actually had players tell me their exact hand on multiple occasions.

Steven Wolansky

Never listen to music. This is advice I've given on countless occasions. Why? Keep reading.

Focus on table conversations. There is so much said during a hand, after a hand, and even during a break that can really help you assess your opponent's decision-making process down the line and make better decisions.

COACH'S CORNER

THINKING ABOUT GOING PRO? NOT SO FAST

Oday's game is solid. Most players at your table are amateurs. Though they're not pros, they play the game well

and have a primary source of income. By definition, they can afford to lose a little and chalk it up to a bad day. So what differentiates a hobby player from a pro? Probably dedication to the game. If you are a hobby player and are a consistent winner, it might be best to keep things the way they are and enjoy the extra winnings.

As a coach, every year I receive emails from players wondering if they should take it to the

next level and play for a living. I have five ideas on this subject:

Real players have the guts to own their results. In texts and conversations with me, my superstar students never use words such as "running bad" and "fish or donkey" and "suckout" and when we run through hands, the hands are relayed in a thoughtful, calm manner. I have heard this described as embracing variance, but let me add if you book three consecutive losses, do not embrace variance. Find your leak. Own your

Pro players have the ability to strike the delicate balance between on-the-table tactics and off-the-table disciplines. One has to play well and it must not be lost on you that a healthy lifestyle, which includes diet, exercise and rest, will keep a player sharp.

Pros see their plan through and know well in advance how long their session will be. Also, they use smart and efficient bankroll management strategies. Schedule your days off. Work your plan.

Poker can be a fun game and I have many students who have played part-time and maintained respectable hourly wages. As soon as a player decides to play for a living, things get tough. Having family 100 percent behind the idea is a great place to start.

The ability to be at the right game is an art. That game might be right next to you or it might be down the street. Pros have a knack for sniffing out an edge. Looking for a good game? Follow the laughter.

Pros should be well-versed in more than just one game. While different games require different skill-sets, take the time to learn a range of games. Make sure you're doing some offthe-table work and an hour a day is a great place to start. It's a great idea to enlist a partner to maybe have lunch with once a week to discuss ideas and results.

Even better, join a poker group. I had a group that met on Wednesdays for five-plus years and we had a healthy variety of player-types and all who participated reaped the rewards. And, of course, get a coach!

PLAYING LIVE FOR THE 1ST TIME, PT. II

There are rules and actions that sometimes elude beginners. Here's a look at some of the more popular ones.

STRING BETS: Putting in a calling bet, then going back for

more chips to add to your bet while announcing, "raise" is a string bet and isn't permitted. If you want to raise, announce it and the amount before you make any betting motion with chips. Your raise is then clearly understood by the table and won't matter if you fumble with chips or go back and forth to your stack.

ALL-IN: If you don't have enough chips to cover a bet, you can announce "all-in." You're

then in the pot for only the portion your money covered until that point. Though you're out of chips, the other players can continue to bet in a side pot, which you aren't eligible to win.

SPLASHING THE POT: When you bet, simply and neatly, put the chips in front of you so the dealer can reach them. Don't toss them onto the table and have them roll or bounce into the pot. This is called "splashing the pot," and may not allow the dealer to precisely count the chips you bet.

PROTECTING YOUR CARDS: Place a chip or small object on your cards after you've looked at them. It lets the dealer know your cards are in play. If not, the dealer may muck your unprotected cards, thinking you wanted to fold. Not being attentive at the table can cost you a pot.

All cards must remain in plain sight and you should not remove them from the table. The best way to view your cards is to shield them with your hands and peek at the two corners of the cards.

And practice remembering those cards as you should avoid frequent looks at them because it's a tell.

At the end of any hand, if you're not sure whether you have the winning hand, turn the cards over and place them just in front of your stack and keep your hand on them until the dealer calls out the winning hand.

Cards speak, so when in doubt, let the dealer make a final determination as you could miss your flush and hit a straight and not realize it.

Make sure you see a winning hand, as some players may misread their hands and announce a hand they don't hold. Once you muck your cards, your hand will be declared dead.

POKER PSYCHOLOGY: HEAD GAMES

BSORB THE ROOM BEFORE PLAYING

Poker is so ubiquitous that we often play poker in new venues.

Way back in the dark ages, except for pros, most of us would

have to go to Las Vegas a couple of times a year to play. Now, there's usually a poker room within driving distance.

Some common scenarios are when you're on vacation and can get away a couple of hours, in a new city for a conference or business and take a cab to the poker room or you're on a road trip with some buddies.

Sports psychology teaches athletes the importance of acclimating to new surroundings.

Teams arrive early to a new venue and some even replicate fan noise during home practices. They try to get an edge, so why shouldn't we?

Many of us get to a new poker room, sign up for a game and then play. This is less than optimal. If you want an edge, you need to work it, a little. You shouldn't just get GPS directions, park and play.

If you want to play optimally, I suggest actually walking around the room to get a feel for it, much like racehorses run a track. I call this "taking a lap." Be intentional by getting used to the sights and sounds; absorb the ambiance. Check out the tables to see how they're playing and see if the stacks are in your comfort level.

Stop the brush or floor and ask about the food. Can you eat tableside? Are drinks comped? Take about five minutes to get a feel for the room and atmosphere. Maybe even sit at the counter or bar and have a soda or coffee.

Once you sit, spot the regulars, the grinders. When you hear the dealer and a player talking about their last time on the golf course together, you can be assured that player has been there before, and often.

Remember, what is a disadvantage also is an advantage. They don't know how you play and you don't know how they play, so if you want to get an edge, notice the non-poker tells.

Among other times, I play every Sunday morning, starting about 7.

Usually, I'm playing against overnighters and about half are out-of-towners. I sit and the same server comes over and says, "Doc, I just brewed a new pot of coffee, ready?"

Anyone observing my Sunday morning would realize the staff knows me. If I don't recognize someone, I know they are from out of town so I chat them up and see if they're on vacation or did they come to grind out the weekend playing poker. Use the information.

And, of course, keep your head in the game.



On a recent Ante Up Poker Cruise, two folks who have seen a lot in long poker careers, Hollywood Casino Toledo Director of Poker Elliott Schecter and Ante Up Poker Cruise poker room manager Ramze Suliman, chatted with Ante Up's Scott Long for a special episode of the Ante Up PokerCast to discuss the past and present of poker.



Why don't people play limit anymore?

ELLIOTT: Many of the games are small enough that no one goes broke. You could go weeks without a winning session, but you could still afford to play. In no-limit, that is just not happening. You lose a few buy-ins in no-limit, you're done. And from the house's perspective, your players don't go broke and the games go much faster.

RAMZE: It used to be that if you wanted to play \$3-\$6 limit, you could take a couple hundred dollars to the casino and say, "No

matter what happens, I'm going to play all night and have a good time." Now, you can sit with \$200-\$300 in a \$1-\$2 no-limit game, get your aces snapped in two minutes and you have to go home. That's it. It took being able to play comfortably out of the equation.

HOW HAVE POKER **TOURNEYS CHANGED?**

RAMZE: The field got really crowded really fast. This is like hot dogs being sold for a dollar, then someone sells them 2-for-1.... The problem with it is players aren't looking at it intelligently anymore. It's an astronomical amount of chips and it doesn't matter. I can give you a million chips and I can still get that tournament over in a matter of hours. As it gets late into a tournament, it gets silly, he bets 1.8M, this should not be the case. In an \$80 weekly tournament, no one should be betting 1.8M.

ELLIOTT: I get dual complaints for almost every tournament series I've run in nine years. "This is all the chips we get? Only 70-minute levels?" and others are saying, "When is this going to end? I have to get back to work this week." So I have to try to find balance. I certainly have to be competitive within our market, so we can't give them less of a play than they can find at a casino close by, but we still have to take those considerations. Being in Toledo, we obviously don't have a healthy core area, but we are on the way to everywhere, so when we run a tournament series, we attract people from a fairly diverse set of markets, and we have to compete with their home casinos, too.

WILL ANY GAME ECLIPSE NO-LIMIT?

RAMZE: The thing about no-limit is it's simple. You go to these highlimit rooms where they are playing badugi and badacey, and all these draws and run it 18 times, the average player is never going to learn that. They're never going to want to learn that. Let's face it; we live in an ADD life these days, so if you can show them something faster and simpler, maybe, but it's going to be hard to find anything faster than "two cards and hang on."

ELLIOTT: Pot-limit Omaha has been the game of the future

for, what, 20 years now? When is the future getting here? It has increased its table percentage in the overall poker market, but nothing is going to take hold'em, whether it's limit or no-limit now. It's pretty much all skill, and the good players will separate the bad players from their money in short order.

Do you want to be the one to tell your players they can't use headphones? Your competition won't.

WHAT'S THE MOST COMMON FLOOR CALL?

ELLIOTT: Action out of order or induced action out of turn. Because for some reason, poker players are generally libertarian and for some of them, they believe in personal responsibility, except when it's their turn to play. So you're always put in a spot where you have to decipher things because no one says a word. That's the most common. Everything else pales in comparison.

RAMZE: And that's been exacerbated by cell phones, iPads, headphones, Internet. There are more distractions than ever before at a poker table. And you can't be competitive if you don't allow it. You can't tell players to be off their phones. We have to be tweeting, watching Netflix, taking pictures, Snapchatting and playing poker all at the same time ... while listening to music.
